#### **Thoughts for Today's Readings**

To the Point: Jesus makes several points in this gospel, but



there is a common theme between them: the ways we conduct our human relationships are not the ways of heaven. It is normal, even good, to be hospitable to friends and family and to enjoy their hospitality in return; this is part of

how communities are built. But these tidy social exchanges do not make us into who we are meant to be. For that, we have to go a step further, offering more radical hospitality to those outside our usual circles, and especially to those who will be unable to repay us. In doing so, we mimic the extravagant self-gift of God, who always gives more than we deserve and more than we can return.

**To Experience:** It might be hard to envision taking literally Jesus' command to host banquets with doors flung open to those we might not know. In a world where we tend to be overly separated from people who are different, the logistics are overwhelming. Whom would we invite? How would we get invitations to them? This command might be calling us, then, to live more radically to begin with, to reach out to the poor in genuine relationship, so that such a banquet does not feel so far out of reach.

- 1. What does hospitality mean to you? How might God be calling you to exceed a secular definition of this term and lean into truly radical and self-giving hospitality?
- 2. How do you stay grounded in God when successes are part of your life? How can you resist the temptation to take credit for the gifts God has given you and the good things that come your way?

#### **The Fourth Commandment**

Every year, at the end of July, the Church celebrates the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. They are honored as the grandparents of Jesus. When we reflect on their lives, we can see how holy and faithful they must have been, for God chose their daughter Mary to be the mother of His Son. The Gospel verse "A good tree does not bear bad fruit" perfectly describes their lives.

Saints Joachim and Anne, through their experience, wisdom, and faith, first nurtured Mary in her faith and later supported Jesus in His early years as loving grandparents. This feast reminds us of the importance of our own grandparents. They are the roots and guides of our family and faith life, holding a precious role in our society.

Grandparents fill our lives with love and share their wisdom and faith for our life's journey. Their stories and smiles we cannot forget. They also pray for us and bring God's blessings to us. Grandparents and elderly people make our lives happy. Their gifts are something great to us.

Therefore, we must not push them aside but instead give them respect and honor in our family and community life. Their experience, wisdom, and faith are treasures that can enrich our lives. Our nation also recognizes this truth and has dedicated a special day – the first Sunday of September (the Sunday after Labor Day) - as Grandparents Day. This year, we will offer special prayers and blessings for all grandparents at all Masses the first weekend of September (that is next weekend).

This Sunday's Gospel invites us to live with humility and selfless love. Jesus teaches us not to seek the places of honor but to live in such a way that we are pleasing in God's sight. He also tells us to invite those who cannot repay us the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame. In many ways, this reflects the love of grandparents: they love us unconditionally, without expecting anything in return.

Therefore, my dear friends, in our families and in our communities, let us approach our elders with humility, learning from their wisdom and leading our families and communities by their wisdom. Let us give them the respect they deserve. Just as they have been witnesses of faith to us, may we also become witnesses of faith for the next generation.

"Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 14:11). May humility, love, and respect for our elders be the foundation of our families and our parish community.

#### Represent Our Parishes in the St. Nazianz Community Parade






