Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: Jesus' words still ring true all these years later; the human tendency to hoard wealth has not gone away. Amassing resources gives us an illusion of control and a

feeling of security. But control and security are not what God wants for us. They quickly become idols, leaving us feeling self-sufficient rather than putting our trust in God. And, as Jesus points out, our possessions do not last beyond this life. They do not come with us when we pass into the next one. We ought to be practicing detachment, regularly letting go of things, so that we can make more space in our lives and in our hearts for God to come in.

To Experience: Many of us have the experience of having too many things. These things occupy our time and attention. They become clutter and require maintenance. We reorganize over and over again and head out for a new set of storage containers to try to get a handle on everything – buying even more stuff to put our stuff into. It sometimes feels like we end up serving our possessions instead of them serving us. Having fewer things isn't just a spiritual practice; it also has the very practical effect of setting us free from some of our bondage to this life.

- 1. How do your possessions hold you back? How much time do you spend cleaning, decluttering, and maintaining your things? Could letting go of some of them restore some space and time to your life?
- 2. What possessions are you perhaps too attached to? How could you practice letting go of those things in order to make more room in your life and heart for God?

Be Rich in What Matters to God

In the Gospel, Jesus is giving reply to a man who wants Him to settle an inheritance dispute. The man says, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." Jesus' reply to him is not straight, but he was teaching the man and the crowd a beautiful lesson regarding the possessions.

When I went home in May, I had to do this job with my father's siblings and with one of my uncles' children. Settling a dispute regarding the possessions is not an easy job in my state. The one who settles the property dispute must deal with a lot of issues between the parties. I told them not to talk about what happened in the past, they followed it. That helped me to settle the problems.

Jesus here in this passage shifts the conversation to a deeper truth: Life is not about the abundance of possessions. He tells a parable of a rich man who stores his harvest, builds bigger barns, and convinces himself that his future is secure. But that very night, he dies. And God's question echoes: "The things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?"

This parable hits close to home in our consumer-driven world. We are constantly tempted to measure our worth by what we have- our bank accounts, houses, success, or reputation. Yet Jesus reminds us: you can be materially rich and spiritually poor. The tragedy of the man in the parable is not his wealth – it's that he was "not rich in what matters to God."

So, what matters to God?

- A grateful and generous heart that shares with the poor.
- A humble soul that trusts in God more than in worldly securities.
- A life that values relationships over riches, virtues over vanity, and eternity over excess.

Being "rich in what matters to God" means investing in love, mercy, service, and faith. It's about storing treasures in heaven, where no thief can steal and no moth can destroy.

This week. let us take time to reflect:

- What am I storing up in my life?
- Am I accumulating things that pass or treasures that last?
- Where do I place my security in God, or in things?

May we seek a richness that cannot be lost – a richness that reflects the heart of God.

Fr. Thomas "Fr. Tom" Krosnicki SVD will be at Holy Trinity Parish and St. Gregory Parish on August 9-10, 2025 to celebrate Masses and to speak about the many ministries of his religious community, Divine Word Missionaries. After his mission assignments he served as the director of the Secretariat of the Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy from 1978-1981, after serving as associate director from 1973-1978. He has also served as a consultor to the Congregation for the Sacraments and Divine Worship. Father Krosnicki earned his doctorate from Sant'Anselmo under the direction of Burkhardt Neunheuser, OSB. His dissertation is entitled, The Postcommunion Prayers of the Missal of Paul VI.




