Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Many parents can relate to the experience of a child going missing. Not many can relate to Mary and Joseph's experience of searching for Jesus for *three days*. The gospel skims over the details of the search, but that's seventy-two sleepless hours of worrying and seeking and not knowing what they may or may not find. And Jesus meets them with an indifference that probably *is* relatable for anyone who's parented a preteen. This moment in the Holy Family's life—the only episode we have of Jesus' childhood—show both their utter uniqueness and the ways in which they are like every family. They have a miscommunication, it leads to a crisis, it resolves, and the child continues to grow. Yes, something big about Jesus' identity and God's plan for salvation is revealed in the process, but it comes in the midst of very everyday realities.

To Experience: We don't often think of Mary scolding Jesus, but here, in the one episode from Jesus' childhood the gospels give us, she is certainly displeased. Even the Holy Family had its ups and downs. In addition to this miscommunication, they would have also weathered all the regular griefs and trials that family life brings. Their love for God and for each other, though, transformed these struggles into the source of their holiness.

1. In this week's readings, Jesus and Samuel both show us the importance of sacred space. What places have been meaningful in your walk with God? Where do you find God must clearly present?
2. On this feast of the Holy Family, we also recognize that our very homes can be sacred spaces. How do you express your faith in your home? How might you carve out a more intentionally sacred space?
3. How does your family life reveal God to you? How do you struggle to find God present in your family members?

Hear to Serve A Family Snapshot

For years, it was a struggle to get a good family portrait. I would beg the children for, "just one good picture, please." I longed for that picture perfect moment to send out to family and friends; that picture perfect moment of our not-so picture perfect family.

The Feast of the Holy Family brings to mind perfect images of Mary, Joseph, and young Jesus. There is a lot of romantic artwork of the Holy Family, illustrating a calm, happy family of three. However, I am not so sure that this was the reality of life for Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

The first snapshot in the Holy Family's album would probably show the faces of Joseph and of Mary's parents as Mary tells them that she had agreed to God's plan, announced by an angel, that she is to become the mother of the Savior. Can you see their expressions? This was not the way things were "supposed" to happen. What would the neighbors and relatives think? It took a great deal of trust for Mary and Joseph to conform their lives to the will of the Lord.

The next snapshot would be of the stable in Bethlehem filled with the animals of travelers. There was no room for them in an inn. They did not have the money or the prestige for better accommodations. They were a family who had to watch their pennies. They were only able to afford the smallest of offerings for the temple sacrifice. They had to rely on the Lord's providence.

What kind of picture would Mary and Joseph have of their hasty departure to Egypt? Can you imagine the talk among the relatives and villagers when Mary and Joseph packed their things for fear of Herod? When they returned years later to Nazareth, were they greeted with open arms or were they viewed with a little fear and suspicion? In times of great difficulty and fear, the Holy Family had to trust that the Lord would protect and guide them.







Mary and Joseph were very human parents. The Gospel reading today gives us a glimpse of an ordinary mother's reaction to finding her son after three days of frantic searching. Mary says to Jesus, "Son, why did you do this to us?" Can you see the picture of Mary hugging Jesus while crying tears of relief? There is a lot of uncertainty and soul-searching that comes with being a parent. Mary and Joseph were raising their son to be a man who would be able to complete his mission of salvation. Mary and Joseph had to trust that even though they did not understand the details, Jesus was created for greatness.

There are no picture-perfect families. However, through prayer and worship we can all strive to be a holy family. A holy family recognizes that they are under the authority and loving care of God. Whatever events or circumstances they find themselves in, they place everything into God's care. A holy family sees the hand of God moving throughout the events of days, weeks, and years. A home where God is invited to dwell and where each person is encouraged to pursue their calling, is the home of a holy family.

While we don't always rejoice in those less than picture perfect moments, let us rejoice in knowing that God is always at work in our families. Ponder that.

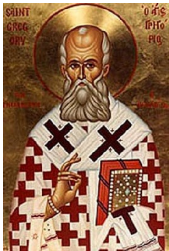

St. Gregory of Nazianzen's Story Feast Day: January 2



After his baptism at 30, Gregory gladly accepted his friend Basil's invitation to join him in a newly founded monastery. The solitude was broken when Gregory's father, a bishop, needed help in his diocese and estate. It seems that Gregory was ordained a priest practically by force, and only reluctantly accepted the responsibility. He skillfully avoided a schism that threatened when his own father made compromises with Arianism. At 41, Gregory was chosen suffragan bishop of Caesarea and at once came into conflict with Valens, the emperor, who supported the Arians.

An unfortunate by-product of the battle was the cooling of the friendship of two saints. Basil, his archbishop, sent him to a miserable and unhealthy town on the border of unjustly created divisions in his diocese. Basil reproached Gregory for not going to his See.

When protection for Arianism ended with the death of Valens, Gregory was called to rebuild the faith in the great see of Constantinople, which had been under Arian teachers for three decades. Retiring and sensitive, he dreaded being drawn into the whirlpool of corruption and violence. He first stayed at a friend's home, which became the only orthodox church in the city. In such surroundings, he began giving the great sermons on the Trinity for which he is famous. In time, Gregory did rebuild the faith in the city, but at the cost of great suffering, slander, insults, and even personal violence. An interloper even tried to take over his bishopric.

His last days were spent in solitude and austerity. He wrote religious poetry, some of it autobiographical, of great depth and beauty. He was acclaimed simply as "the Theologian." St. Gregory Nazianzen shares the celebration of his liturgical feast with St. Basil the Great on January 2.

Reflection

It may be small comfort, but post-Vatican II turmoil in the Church is a mild storm compared to the devastation caused by the Arian heresy, a trauma the Church has never forgotten. Christ did not promise the kind of peace we would love to have—no problems, no opposition, no pain. In one way or another, holiness is always the way of the cross.
