Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Even when we are familiar with these words, this gospel contains some of Jesus' hardest teachings. It goes against our hardwired self-protective

instincts to love enemies and to do good to those who wish us ill. When we are struck, our nervous system tells us to fight or flee—and with good reason. God made us this way so that we can avoid harm. Jesus tells us, though, to rise above these reflexes and to choose a supernatural path, one we can only hope to achieve with his help. We might fear that such instructions will let us be taken advantage of, and that's true: at no point does Jesus promise that we will not be taken advantage of in this world. He calls us not to self-preservation but to live with the radical love and generosity that he will model when he washes his disciples' feet and ultimately lays down his very life for us.

To Experience: Safety and security often become something of an idol for us. We pursue them wholeheartedly, wanting to know that we are in control and that bad things will not happen to us. The truth is, of course, that we are never really in control and that bad things happen even to the most prepared of people. We find our true selves when we give our whole hearts not to self-preservation but to the God who promises to make us anew.

- 1. How have you experienced God's kindness and mercy?
- 2. Who do you perceive as your enemies? How could you expand your love for them?
- 3. How could you extend radical forgiveness to someone who has hurt you?

The Radical Call to Love

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus presents one of the most challenging teachings in all of Scripture: "Love

your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." At first, this seems impossible. How can we love those who hurt us? How can we bless when we are wounded? Yet, this is precisely what makes Christian love different. Jesus is not asking for an ordinary love, but a divine love - the kind of love that transforms hearts, breaks down barriers, and heals wounds.

Loving those who love us is easy. But Jesus calls us higher. He calls us to reflect God's own mercy, to love without counting the cost, to give without expecting in return. The world tells us

to seek revenge, to hold grudges, to return insult for insult. But Jesus offers a different path - the path of mercy, forgiveness, and radical generosity. When we love in this way, we reveal the heart of God to the world.



The promise of Jesus is clear: "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be poured into your lap." Love multiplies when we give it away. Mercy comes back to us when we extend it to others. The more we forgive, the more we are set free.

As we reflect on this Gospel, let us ask ourselves: Is there someone in my life I need to forgive? Can I choose kindness over resentment? Can I bless instead of curse? This week let's make a conscious effort to love as Jesus loves - to be instruments of mercy in our families, our workplaces, and our parish community.

May the Lord give us the grace to live out His radical call to love, so that we may become true witnesses of His mercy in the world.

Mass Changes Effective March 8 & 9

A new process will be followed for the presentation of gifts and for the commentators . This will begin during the Lenten season:

Presentation Gifts – Greeters will be responsible for asking parishioners to bring up gifts but may do it themselves if they wish. Presenters will be bringing gifts up at the same time ushers go up to begin their collection. Once collection is complete, an usher may bring the basket to the sanctuary without handing it to Father or Deacon.

Commentators will remain in the back of church until about a minute before Mass begins. They will then proceed to the front of church, make the announcements, and then return to the back of church for the procession. If they choose to they are welcome to return to their seats after the reading and/or intentions are complete or they may stay in the sanctuary. If preferred, they may remain in their seats until it is time for the reading.

Presentation of Gifts Sign Up

Beginning in the Lenten season, the Greeters will be asking parishioners to bring up the offertory gifts of Bread and Wine. However, we strongly encourage you to sign up in advance if the Mass is being offered for a loved one or if you are celebrating an anniversary or birthday or just because you want to participate in the Mass in a different way.

A small black binder (7"x9") will be at the back of church to sign up for Presentation of Gifts. Find the page with the date of the Mass and write your name on the line that corresponds with the desired Mass time. Thank you!



- Give up online shopping






