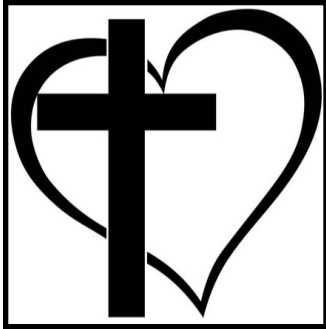

"They left everything  
and followed Him"  
(Luke 5:11)

Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's Gospel, Jesus calls Simon Peter, James, and John to follow Him. After witnessing the miraculous catch of fish, they leave everything behind - their boats, their nets, their livelihood - and follow Jesus without hesitation. This moment is not just abandoning possessions but about a radical trust in Christ. They step into the unknown, guided by faith rather than certainty.

What does it mean for us today to "leave everything and follow Him"? While not everyone is called to leave their jobs or homes, every Christian is invited to place Christ at the center of their lives. Following Jesus means surrendering our fears, doubts, and personal plans to embrace His will. It means choosing faith over worry, love over resentment, and selflessness over personal gain.

We follow Jesus in our daily lives when we make time for prayer, when we serve the poor and the suffering, when we forgive those who wrong us, and when we trust God even in uncertainty. Sometimes, following Jesus requires leaving behind our pride, bad habits, or distractions that keep us from growing in faith.

Jesus' invitation is as real today as it was on the shores of Galilee. He calls us to a deeper relationship with Him, to let go of whatever holds us back, and to trust in His providence. This week, take a moment to reflect: What is Jesus asking me to leave behind so that I can follow Him more closely? May we, like the first disciples, have the courage to say "yes" to His call and walk in faith.

## Thoughts for Today's Readings



**To the Point:** Peter's journey with Christ can give us whiplash—he will challenge Jesus, misunderstand him, follow him into deep waters, doubt him, deny him, and finally land as the shepherd of Christ's flock, ready to endure persecution and death as a result of his preaching. Here, we see him at the moment that started it all. Peter is reckless: one miracle and he is ready to leave everything—his boats and nets and even the miraculous catch of fish Jesus has just provided. He is a man seized by love, love that he will not live out perfectly but that will see him through a lifetime with Jesus. Although his journey with Christ will have its ups and downs, this first encounter changes everything.

**To Experience:** Peter is a magnificently imperfect person—and God still chooses him to lead the early church and to hold a place of honor in our ecclesial memory. God knows all our imperfections, our shortcomings, and our sins, and God chooses us anyway. God is always bigger than our inadequacy. When we say yes to cooperating with God, God will fill in the gaps in our abilities and can make wonderful things happen.

1. Peter does not always live up to the reckless love with which he leaves everything and follows Jesus. His journey with Christ, like all of ours, will have ups and downs. Where are you on you walk with Jesus? How might Peter accompany you wherever you are?
2. What imperfections do you have that you try to keep out of your life of faith? How might you offer these to God to work with?
3. What might God be asking you to leave behind to more wholeheartedly follow Jesus?

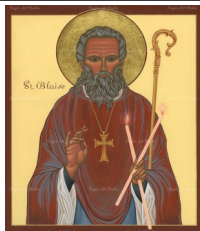
### Mass Changes Effective March 8 & 9

A new process will be followed for the presentation of gifts and for the commentators . This will begin during the Lenten season:

**Presentation Gifts – Greeters** will be responsible for asking parishioners to bring up gifts but may do it themselves if they wish. Presenters will be bringing gifts up at the same time ushers go up to begin their collection. Once collection is complete, an usher may bring the basket to the sanctuary without handing it to Father or Deacon.

**Commentators** will remain in the back of church until about a minute before Mass begins. They will then proceed to the front of church, make the announcements, and then return to the back of church for the procession. If they choose to they are welcome to return to their seats after the reading and/or intentions are complete or they may stay in the sanctuary. If preferred, they may remain in their seats until it is time for the reading.

### Blessing of the Throat



#### About St. Blaise

St. Blaise is a bishop and martyr who lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. For a time, Blaise lived in a cave to escape persecution. On his feast the church recalls a miracle cure associated with him and celebrates the blessing of the throats. Blaise apparently saved the life of a boy

who was choking on a fish bone. The saint said that anyone who lit a candle in his memory would be free of infection, thus candles are used in the traditional throat blessing. He is listed among the Fourteen Holy Helpers, saints revered as healers. He is the patron saint of throat illnesses, animals, wool combers, and wool trading.

#### Blessing of the Throat

On February 3, the Feast Day of St. Blaise, the Church recalls a miracle cure associated with him and celebrates the blessing of the throats with candles.

St. Blaise said that anyone who lit a candle in his memory would be free of infection, thus candles are used in the traditional throat blessing. The candles (blessed on Candlemas Feb. 2) are crossed against the throat, and the following prayer is said:

“Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil.  
In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.  
Amen.”

#### Crossed Candles

Crossed candles are an important part of Saint Blaise Day, they commemorate the mother of the boy who choked on the fishbone. She presented Saint Blaise with crossed candles to light his way to jail when the ruler of Sebastea ordered his arrest. The origin of the blessing of throats uses crossed candles as a symbol.
