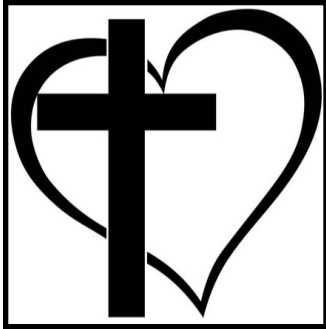

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In John's gospel, Jesus begins his public ministry with an unusual miracle. Most of Jesus' miracles are about healing, restoring their recipients to a baseline level of physical or spiritual health. Here, though, Jesus shows that he doesn't just care about the bare necessities. His desire for us is *abundance*. In this instance, there is no real need, just a party about to wind down. In response, he makes wine flow freely—the gospel is specific about the amount, but it is hard to envision this quantity: each of these six stone jars can fit about a hundred of our standard bottles of wine. Jesus cares about our basic bodily needs, and he also cares that we experience joy, friendship, and love—the fullness of life for which we were created.

To Experience: It is hard to understand that life gives some of us abundant joy and love while others of us go without our basic needs met. There is sometimes judgment of poor people who are able to attain a large TV, a fancy phone, or an occasional vacation. If you are not poor, try to reserve your judgment; remember that those with little money are also deserving of the things that enrich our lives.

1. Think of a time when you have felt flooded by goodness. When has Jesus provided for you in a way that felt abundant?
2. Share about a good and holy marriage you've witnessed that reveals something about God's love to you.
3. If you are in a place of abundance, how could you live a bit more simply in order to share that abundance with others?

ROSARY IN A YEAR

Last year, one of the things I felt Jesus was telling me to do was to pray the Rosary. This year, I felt Jesus telling me to go deeper. So, I started listening to a podcast called *Rosary in a Year*. It is from Ascension Press and is presented by Father Mark-Mary Ames. These are the same people who brought us *Bible in a Year* which became the number one podcast for several years.

I was happy to learn that *Rosary in a Year* just isn't some podcast that prays the Rosary with you for 365 days. It's been designed to begin with the foundation of the Rosary, the how, the why, and the history. It is intended to help us build our relationship with the Trinity, with Mary, and with all the saints.

Each episode is about 15 minutes. If you miss a day, you can always go back and catch up. The other nice thing about these podcasts are that you can repeat them as many times as you want. The year is divided into six stages.

Stage 1: The first part is about forming relationships: with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, along with Mary and all the Saints. Fr. Mark-Mary gives an explanation followed by praying one Our Father, three Hail Mary's and one Glory Be.

Stage 2: Biblical Roots: Fr. Mark-Mary goes over the biblical roots of the Rosary, covering the scripture verses for the Mysteries and the prayers associated with the Rosary. I am looking forward to this because it sounds interesting and may be helpful to defend our faith and to help us explain the Rosary to those who misunderstand it.

Stage 3: Meditation on the Mysteries: They will look at the Mysteries individually, the scripture associated with each Mystery and then pray *Lectio Divina* for each Mystery. The focus will be one Mystery a day.

Stage 4: Prayer and focus: By spending just 10 minutes, meditating on one Mystery and praying that Mystery we will put into practice what we have learned so far.

Stage 5: Building up the Decades: We are going to start building our prayer muscle by praying two decades a day. By the end of this stage, we will be doing a whole rosary.

Stage 6: The final stage is praying the whole Rosary every day until the end of the year.

I don't know about you but I think this will be great for Rosary veterans and newbies alike to grow in prayer. I am looking forward to having more insights into the Mysteries and a greater appreciation of the Rosary. If I develop a deeper relationship with the Trinity and Mary, what could be better than that?

I am glad I listened to Jesus and began praying the Rosary. If you want to join me, go to ascensionpress.com/riy. Hopefully, we can become Rosary Warriors who have the strength and courage to listen to Mary's words in today's Gospel, "Do whatever He tells you."

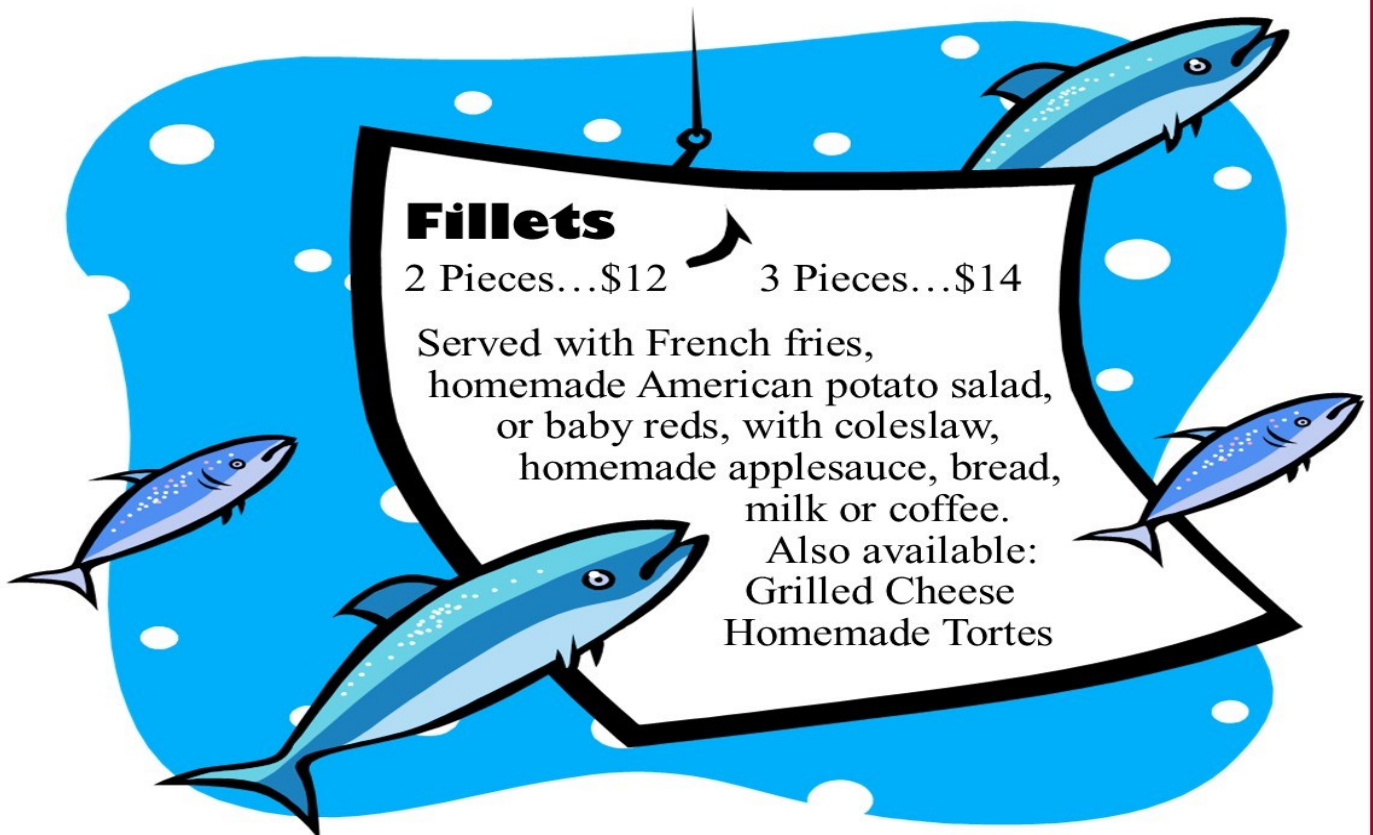

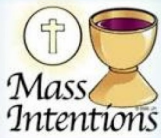

Mass for the People of the Parish

Each week, normally on one of the weekend Masses, you will notice that one of the Masses is offered for the "People of Holy Trinity and St. Gregory Parishes." This Mass is referred to as the "pro populo"

Mass, which is Latin "for the people." Per Code of Canon Law* the pastor of a parish (or in this case the parish administrator) is obligated to offer Mass for the benefit of the people of the parish each Sunday and every Holy Day of Obligation. Since this is a requirement of the law, the parish does not collect a stipend for this Mass. For a priest that has care of more than one parish, he may offer one Mass to cover all the parishes he serves. On occasion, the Mass "pro populo" can be shifted to a weekday, but this should be the exception, and not the normal practice.

Mass for the Families of the Parish

Have you noticed a Mass being offered for your family, but you don't know who scheduled it? Masses can be offered for the benefit of any person living or dead, or for any intention, as long as it is not contrary to the teachings of the Church. Sunday Masses are by far the most popular dates that people request for Mass intention. Since the law only allows one stipend per Mass*, Mass intentions for Sundays usually fill up fairly quickly. However, Mass intentions for weekday Masses often remain open. The practice in both parishes is that when there is an open Mass intention, the families of the parishes are scheduled for the intention. In this way, the parish administrator can offer Mass for the spiritual benefit of every family in the parish. Since these intentions are scheduled by the parish office, you are not required to pay the customary Mass stipend, nor are you required to attend the Mass. These Mass Intentions are added at the time of bulletin publication. They are not scheduled in advance, limiting the availability of dates to parishioners.

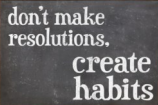
