Thoughts for Today's Readings


To the Point: In this gospel Jesus begins to delegate. He sends his apostles to extend his work of preaching and healing. His instructions are hard. They are to go with no supplies and are to rely on the hospitality of others. They are to expect rejection and are to settle nowhere. Yet they do not go alone. Jesus sends them in pairs. And he goes with them, too, in a way, giving them his own authority over unclean spirits and his own power to heal those who are sick. In the same way, Jesus goes with us, remaining with the church in the sacraments. God also gives us each other as companions on the long journey of Christian life, and is present to us in any relationship where love reigns.

To Experience: We might occupy any number of roles from the readings this week. We might be as the disciples, called and sent to minister to others, spreading Jesus' healing presence. We might also be as those who reject them, unwilling or unable to see God's presence in an unexpected prophet. Prophets often call our attention to inconvenient truths, and it is easier to ignore them than to accept the disruptions they cause. But God works through those disruptions, using them to shake off our apathy and call our attention to places that need conversion and healing.

- Jesus sends the Twelve out to minister in groups of two. What companions do you have in your ministry? How do they support you?
- 2. Have you experienced rejection for the sake of your faith? How did you respond?
- When the disciples arrived in a town, they would have interrupted the normal way of doing things. How have you found God in interruptions to the comfortable things in life?

FIGHT THE GOOD FIGHT

In this week's Gospel, Jesus sent out the Apostles two by two. What is the first thing Jesus assigns them to do? They are

to fight unclean spirits. The first thing the Apostles do

in a pastoral capacity is to cast out demons.

Back in the 60's and 70's, talk of demons and unclean spirits were dismissed as nothing more than superstition. The devil was downplayed as something we made up in our minds as an excuse for our bad behavior. This is still a very common belief today when we talk about the devil. We have made the devil something very abstract. By doing this, we have played into his hands.

When we see families, societies, communities, and parishes collapsing, we no doubt will find a plethora of accusation and division. You can be sure that this is the devil at work. We would be fools to front and center. He is clandestine. He likes to use suggestion, temptation, and influence to get us to do his will. Very seldom is the devil's work like that movie The Exorcist. No one's head is spinning 360 degrees, and we're not floating in the air above our beds.

The devil is much more subtle. One of his greatest devices is to scatter and pull apart causing division and lack of peace and understanding. Another trick is accusation. If we think about it, how often do we find ourselves thinking otherwise.

But Jesus through His Death and Resurrection has won for us a victory over these dark forces. He has given us the weapons to fight them. As we follow the Apostolic succession, we come to our own Bishop David Ricken. He too recognizes the need to fight these unclean spirits, to fight the devil. This is one of the reasons that he instituted the Five Alive practices in our Diocese. He wants us to renew our lives with weapons that we have forgotten about, or we have dismissed, to fight the devil. These weapons are the Mass, Lectio Divina, Eucharistic Adoration, Confession and praying the Rosary. Now, I know you have all heard about these practices before, but on this 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time it is a good time to reflect. Have we made any effort to bring these practices alive in our lives? Have we made them a relevant part of our lives to help fight against these attacks of the devil?

If we haven't done that yet, now is a good time to start. The devil is not going to go away by us ignoring him, or by us thinking we can battle him on our own. We need these tools given to us by Christ and His Church to help us.

Let us use the tools given to us by Christ and His Church to Fight the Good Fight.

Second Collection—Missionary Cooperation Plan Weekend of July 20 & 21

(MCP) is promoted through the Catholic Foundation World Mission office every summer, and is conducted in dioceses across the United States. These collections are a way to centralize the efforts of missionary organizations around the world who wish to appeal to Catholics in the U.S. Each year, from over 300 applications, Bishop Ricken invites 38 groups to participate. This Appeal allows mission groups to make a personal appeal for prayers and financial support from Catholics in our diocese. In our Diocese, receipts from all the 156 parishes are pooled and divided equally among these selected mission groups. We use this fair-share system to enable our missionary speakers to go to less populated parishes in our Diocese without fear of receiving less income. Missionaries share the needs and their faith experiences of the people they serve. Missionaries enrich us in our understanding of the problems and challenges of the global church. Our faith is deepened and broadened as we learn from them.

We welcome Mr. Alex Aldana from COAR, a School and Orphanage in El Salvador. COAR, which stands for the Community Oscar Arnulfo Romero, will be making an upcoming mission appeal and asking for your donations, prayers, and interest.

COAR is located in Zaragoza, El Salvador. It was founded in 1980 by a Cleveland Diocese Mission Team priest Fr. Ken Myers during El Salvador's brutal civil war. Fr. Ken and fellow Cleveland Mission Team members Sr. Dorothy Kazel, OSU, and Jean Donovan (murdered December 2, 1980) began gathering orphans from refugee camps and bringing them back to the Mission's parish of Zaragoza.

COAR is now known as the "Children's Village" in El Salvador with 1,000 day students at the school, as well as foster care, workshops, and other services. It is administered directly by the Archbishop of San Salvador through his Vicariate of Human Development. COAR's motto is Women and Men for God and Culture: the curriculum educates the entire person. With over 30 employees COAR strengthens the regional economy. One of the first orphans of COAR served as mayor of Zaragoza from 1998 - 2002. COAR buzzes with optimism and vitality.

However, El Salvador remains an impoverished country as are COAR's students. To protect the most vulnerable simply requires food, shelter, and housemothers. To educate the children to modernize their economy requires updated computers and new classrooms. To get the best teachers and treat them fairly requires wages near the Salvadoran national average. Please help us respond to the needs of the most impoverished among us and help them build a better future.
