#### **Thoughts for Today's Readings**




**To the Point:** We might feel some pity for Jesus here—after a busy stretch of ministry he attempts to retreat with the apostles only to find that the crowds have walked to meet them. But his response is not

one of annoyance or impatience, justified as those reactions would be. He rather sees the need of those who are seeking him, and he responds to that need with compassion. He is able to do so in part because he does not operate from a scarcity mindset. It seems there is not enough time for both ministry and rest, but Jesus operates from a place of trust. In God his needs and ours will be abundantly met, and Jesus is able to share that generosity with those who are seeking him.

**To Experience:** It is common to be frustrated at the lack of rest available to those who work in ministry. The liturgical calendar never sleeps, and people are in continuous need of pastoral care. This episode where the crowds thwart Jesus' attempt to take a rest is almost comical. But it is notable that Jesus does try to step away. He acknowledges here that we cannot keep going without time to recharge and renew our commitment. Our attempts to rest might be imperfect and interrupted, but is it important to keep trying.

- In this gospel, people hasten to be in Jesus' presence. How do you approach Jesus in prayer? Is it with urgency, hesitancy, eagerness, fear?
- 2. How do you make room for rest in the midst of your ministry? How could you see Jesus' example as an invitation to balance both of these needs?
- 3. How has God been generous with you? How do you extend that generosity to others?

On July 16, all four branches of the historic Pilgrimage (The pilgrims on the Marian route passed through St. Nazianz in June.) converged in Indianapolis for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress—a milestone within the Revival and a historic moment for the Church in the US.

Daily Opportunities for Participants at Congress:

- National Shroud of Turin Exhibit (replica of the artifact)—The Shroud of Turin is a rectangular linen cloth comprised of flax measuring 14.6 feet long and 3.5 feet wide. It bears a faint yellowed image of a bearded, crucified man with bloodstains that match the wounds suffered by Jesus of Nazareth as recorded in all four gospel narratives. Since 1578 the Shroud of Nazareth has resided in Turin, Italy, thus the name, the Shroud of Turin. The holy relic is housed in the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. Millions of Christians from all denominations believe that the Shroud is the authentic burial cloth used to wrap Jesus after his death on the cross, and found by his disciples in the empty tomb after his resurrection.
- Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit—A powerful exhibit to explore some of the most amazing Eucharistic miracles from around the world. This collection of miracles was compiled by Blessed Carlo Acutis to bolster faith and leave you in awe of the very real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
- Reliquary Chapel—Relics of the patrons of the Eucharistic Revival, Congress, and Pilgrimage will be displayed for veneration. Patrons include Blessed Carlo Acutis, St. Manuel Gonzalez Garcia, St. Paschal Baylon, St. Junipero Serra, The Veil of Our Lady, St. Juan Diego, and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton.

In addition, participants had opportunities to attend various Masses (Spanish, Vietnamese, Eastern Rite, Byzantine, etc), pray the Rosary, attend musical performances, partake as an audience member of a Catholic podcast recording, join a Eucharistic procession, participate in Eucharistic Adoration, perform service to others by being the hands and feet of Christ as they contribute to the packing of 360,000 meals for those in need. Each day also offered impact sessions with dynamic speakers and afternoon breakout sessions.

Over the next two weeks, Jean Blattner and Danielle Faust will each share their first-hand experiences of attending the National Eucharistic Congress.


