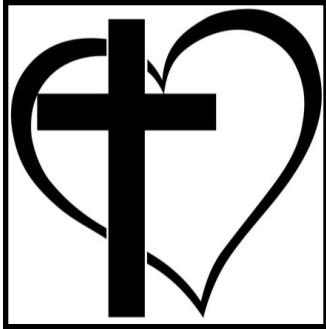

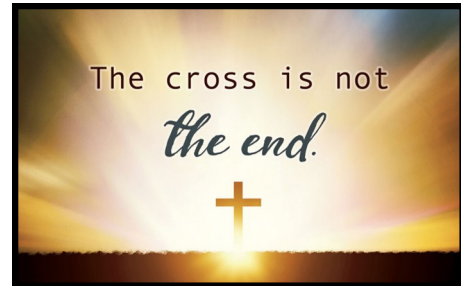

A Journey from the Cross to Glory

Dear Friends in Christ,

Lent is often seen as a season of sacrifice, a time to give up something and walk the path of penance. But today's Gospel of the Transfiguration invites us to see beyond suffering - to the glory that awaits us.

Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, where they witness something incredible. His appearance changes, His clothes become dazzling white, and He stands with Moses and Elijah. Then, they hear a voice from heaven. "This is my chosen Son. Listen to Him." Imagine the awe and wonder of this moment! Yet, despite this glorious vision, Jesus tells them not to speak of it until after His resurrection. Why? Because glory comes through the Cross.

This Gospel is a reminder that our faith journey is not just about trials but about transfiguration. Peter wanted to stay on the mountain, but Jesus led them back down to face the reality of suffering. We, too, may want to hold onto moments of joy and avoid hardships. However, Lent teaches us that through prayer, fasting, and acts of love, we are being prepared for something greater.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let's ask ourselves: Are we truly listening to Jesus? Are we allowing Him to transform us, even in moments of struggle? Just as the disciples saw Christ's glory, we, too, are called to experience His presence in our lives - not just in times of comfort, but even in the challenges.

This week, let's take time to reflect: Where is Jesus leading us? How is He calling us to deeper faith? And most importantly, are we willing to follow Him - not just to the mountain of glory, but through the valleys of sacrifice?

The Cross is not the end; it is the path to Resurrection.

Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: In the biblical imagination, mountains are often a privileged place of encounter with God.

Their heights are somewhere between heaven and earth, so they are seen as an in-between place where the usual boundaries between the natural and the supernatural are thinner. Peter, John, and James see some extraordinary things in their mountaintop experiences. They see Moses and Elijah—two other men who met God on a mountain—and might come to understand Jesus as part of their prophetic lineage. What they do not yet understand is that Jesus both fulfills and transcends what God has done in the past. They no longer need to ascend the mountain, because Jesus himself is a place of encounter with God. In him, God has become newly accessible, dwelling among us in an unprecedented way.

To Experience: When Peter, John, and James experience the transfiguration, they do not immediately run out and share it. They instead fall silent, perhaps joining Mary in pondering in their hearts their wonderful but bewildering new experience of God.

1. In the biblical imagination, mountains are often privileged places of encounter with God. Where do you find God more accessible? Where do you go when you need to be reminded of God's presence?
2. The transfiguration reveals something about Jesus, but it also leaves the disciples bewildered and frightened. What is an area of your life that feels confusing or dark? How would you like God to shine divine light there?
3. The disciples fall silent after what they witness on the mountain, there are times to proclaim what we have seen of Jesus, and there are times to take it in and let it shape us. How do you discern when to proclaim and when to be silent?



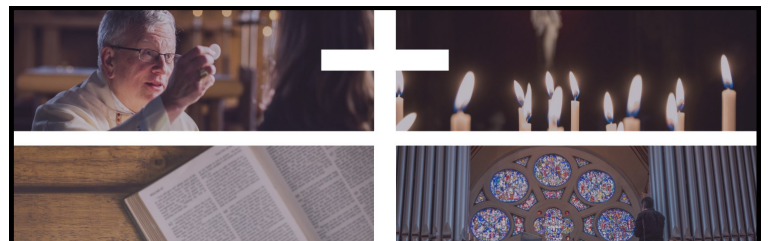
Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Training

Parish Records Update Needed



Many of the records in the parishioner database in the offices are in need of updates. There are many landline numbers that are no longer used. There are outdated email contacts. Many families have children who have grown up, are on their own, have their own family, or no longer live in the area but the children are listed with their parents.

After Masses on March 22 & 23, March 29 & 30, and April 5 & 6, volunteers will be at the back each church with a printout of your current record. You are asked to review it and make the changes. New information will then be entered into the office database.

Children may remain on the parent's record until age 26 (per GB Diocese guidelines). At 26 years old, you are asked to register independently. If you have not previously registered, we'd love for you to become a register member. Please take time to complete a parishioner registration form. Forms will be available from the volunteers.

Each parish will have the print outs at their respective parishes. Please make time to provide us with the update. All parishioners whose records are not updated at Mass will need to be contacted in another way. Help us save time and extra steps.

Information to confirm or correct:

- Family members who are currently active or inactive
- Residential address (and mailing address, if different)
- Landline number (if applicable)
- Cell phone numbers for adults in household
- Primary household email address
- Email addresses for adults in household (especially if serving in ministry or on a committee)
