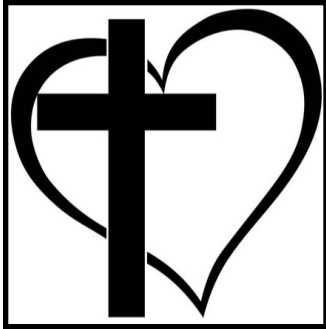

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In this gospel, Jesus pushes back on a "better than me" mentality he is finding in his listeners. They seem to believe that they deserve the good things they have received in this life and that people to whom bad things have happened somehow deserved those bad things. Jesus pushes them to greater solidarity, insisting that it is not because of their sin that those bad things happened and that those things could happen to anyone. Bad things happening in the world is an effect of sin, but it is not a direct effect of *personal* sin. The world is broken by evil, and bad things happen at random to people regardless of how directly they cooperate with that evil.

To Experience: When something goes wrong for someone else, it is a common human tendency to seek out what that person did wrong. It is natural to look for a logical reason for the bad things that happen; we are trying to reassure ourselves that we are still in control of whether they happen to us. Jesus challenges us, though, to seek greater solidarity, to react to others' bad news with empathy rather than judgment, knowing that such things could also happen to us.

1. In the first reading, Moses is called by God to lead Israel out of captivity. What special work do you feel God calling you to do? How have you answered God's call in your life?
2. How could you show support for family or friends who are suffering?
3. How are you bearing fruit for God? How might God be calling you to prune away some excess in this Lenten season so that you can bear greater fruit?

A Call to Repentance and Fruitfulness



In Luke 13:1-9, Jesus speaks of two tragic events - one involving Galileans killed by Pilate and another where eighteen people died when a tower collapsed. The people thought these victims must have been terrible sinners, but Jesus corrects them: "Do you think they were worse sinners than others? No, but unless you repent, you will be likewise perish."

This is a powerful reminder that suffering and tragedy are not necessarily punishments for sin. Instead, they are moments that call us to reflect on our own lives. When we hear of disasters, sickness, or unexpected deaths, our first thought shouldn't be, "Why did this happen to them?" but rather, "Am I ready to meet God? Am I bearing the fruits He desires?"

The Barren Fig Tree: God's Patience and Mercy

Jesus follows this lesson with a parable about a barren fig tree. The owner, frustrated that the tree has produced no fruit for three years, wants to cut it down. But the gardener intercedes: "Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not, you can cut it down."

This parable speaks of God's mercy and patience. The fig tree represents our lives. God has planted us in His vineyard - the Church - and He expects us to bear fruit. Yet, like the tree, we sometimes remain spiritually stagnant, failing to grow in holiness, charity, and love.

But see how merciful God is! He does not immediately cut us down in judgment. Instead, Jesus - the Divine Gardener - pleads for more time, giving us grace, opportunities, and second chances. However, His patience is not endless. The tree was given another year, not an indefinite extension. Likewise, we are given time to repent and grow, but we do not know how long that time will be.

The Gospel challenges us in two ways:

Examining our hearts - Are we bearing fruit? Are we growing in love, prayer, and service to others? Or have we become spiritually lazy, assuming that God's mercy will always wait?

Use God's grace wisely - Lent is a season of "digging and fertilizing" our souls. God offers us the Eucharist, confession, Stations of the Cross, prayer, and acts of charity to help us grow. But it is up to us to respond.

If God comes today and looks at the tree of our lives, will He find fruit?

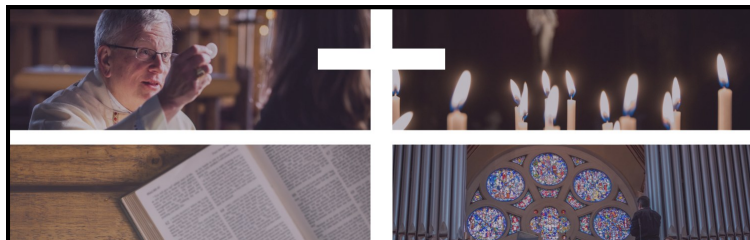
Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Training

Parish Records Updates Happening Now

Many of the records in the parishioner database in the offices are in need of updates. There are many landline numbers that are no longer used. There are outdated email contacts. Many families have children who have grown up, are on their own, have their own family, or no longer live in the area but the children are listed with their parents.

After Masses on **March 22 & 23, March 29 & 30, and April 5 & 6**, volunteers will be at the back each church with a printout of your current record. You are asked to review it and make the changes. New information will then be entered into the office database.

Children may remain on the parent's record until age 26 (per GB Diocese guidelines). At 26 years old, you are asked to register inde-

pendently. If you have not previously registered, we'd love for you to become a register member. Please take time to complete a parishioner registration form. Forms will be available from the volunteers.

Each parish will have the print outs at their respective parishes. Please make time to provide us with the update. All parishioners whose records are not updated at Mass will need to be contacted in another way. Help us save time and extra steps.

Information to confirm or correct:

- Family members who are currently active or inactive
- Residential address (and mailing address, if different)
- Landline number (if applicable)
- Cell phone numbers for adults in household
- Primary household email address
- Email addresses for adults in household (especially if serving in ministry or on a committee)
