### Thoughts for Today's Readings

**To the Point:** This gospel gives us the basis for our Lenten season. Jesus spends forty days in the desert, echoing the forty days Noah's ark was afloat and the forty years the Israelites spent in the desert before entering the Promised Land. In that time, Jesus fasts far more intensely than we do. He also wrestles with the devil, coming face-to-face with what he needs to sacrifice in order to do and be what God intends for him. In fulfilling God's will, he will give up power and security that could easily be his. The gospel is clear that this is a temptation for Jesus—while he seems to bat away the devil's words easily, he faces these temptations as a human and probably feels that he could do more good for God if he were fed and powerful and safe. His intimate knowledge of his Father, though, helps him remember that these are not the most important things and that God is calling him to something greater amid the sacrifices he will make.

**To Experience:** Catholics like to joke that we don't know Scripture well, but that ignorance is not actually a fundamental part of Catholic identity! Our religious education tends not to emphasize Scripture memorization in the way that our Protestant brothers and sisters often do, but knowing God's word should absolutely be part of any Christian's life of prayer. The ease with which Jesus uses Scripture in this gospel makes clear that he has already spent a lifetime immersed in it. Including Scripture in our prayer, then, is a way of following Jesus.

1. God's word plays a prominent role in this gospel. How do you pray with Scripture? How could you find ways to spend more time with it?
2. When has Scripture offered you strength and encouragement during a difficult time?
3. It is rather chilling to hear the devil twist the words of Scripture to suit his purposes. Where do you hear God's word being misused or misappropriated to suit an agenda?

## Lent: A Time of Renewal



Lent is a sacred period of 40 days observed by us worldwide, a time of prayer, penance, fasting, and almsgiving. These 40 days echo the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness before beginning His public ministry (Matthew 4:1-11). But Lent is not just about emulating Jesus' sacrifice - it is a time to reflect deeply on the spiritual significance of the number 40, both in biblical history and in our lives today.

The number 40 holds profound meaning in the Bible. It marks the times of testing, purification, and transformation. For instance, the flood in Noah's time lasted 40 days and 40 nights (Genesis 7:12), as God cleansed the earth of its corruption, giving humanity a chance for renewal. This event symbolizes God's judgment and mercy - He cleansed the earth, but also preserved life, making way for new beginnings. In the same way, Lent provides us an opportunity to cleanse our hearts, to leave behind the "old" ways of sin, and to prepare ourselves for the "new" life in Christ.

Lent mirrors God's original act of creation, as described in the first chapters of Genesis. In Genesis 1, God created the world out of chaos, bringing order, beauty, and life where there was none. But by Genesis 6-8, we see that humanity's choices had upset this divine creation. The earth was filled with violence, and God's heart was grieved (Genesis 6:5-6). Yet, even in His anger, God spared Noah and his family, preserving life and offering a chance to recreate what was broken. This story underscores the importance of repentance - turning away from sin and turning back to God for renewal. As we embark on our 40 days of Lent, we too are called to recreate our souls. Just as God gave humanity a fresh start through Noah, He offers us a new beginning through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Lent invites us to reflect on how we may have disrupted our relationship with God, others, or ourselves, and to seek renewal through prayer, repentance, and forgiveness.

This Lent, let us remember that the 40 days are not just a time of sacrifice, but a time of recreation - a chance for us to reflect on how we can rebuild our lives in alignment with God's will. As we reflect on the early chapters of Genesis, let us find hope in the truth that God is always ready to restore, renew, and recreate. Through Jesus' sacrifice, we are given the opportunity for spiritual transformation and a renewed heart. Let us embrace this season of Lent as a sacred time to rebuild our souls and deepen our relationship with the Creator.

**Mass Changes  
Effective This Weekend—March 8 & 9**

A new process will be followed for the presentation of gifts and for the commentators. This will begin during the Lenten season:

**Presentation Gifts** – Greeters will be responsible for asking parishioners to bring up gifts but may do it themselves if they wish. Presenters will be bringing gifts up at the same time ushers go up to begin their collection. Once collection is complete, an usher may bring the basket to the sanctuary without handing it to Father or Deacon.

Commentators will remain in the back of church until about a minute before Mass begins. They will then proceed to the front of church, make the announcements, and then return to the back of church for the procession. If they choose to they are welcome to return to their seats after the reading and/or intentions are complete or they may stay in the sanctuary. If preferred, they may remain in their seats until it is time for the reading.

**Presentation of Gifts Sign Up**

Beginning in the Lenten season, the Greeters will be asking parishioners to bring up the offertory gifts of Bread and Wine. However, we strongly encourage you to sign up in advance if the Mass is being offered for a loved one or if you are celebrating an anniversary or birthday or just because you want to participate in the Mass in a different way.

A small black binder (7"x9") will be at the back of church to sign up for Presentation of Gifts. Find the page with the date of the Mass and write your name on the line that corresponds with the desired Mass time. Thank you!

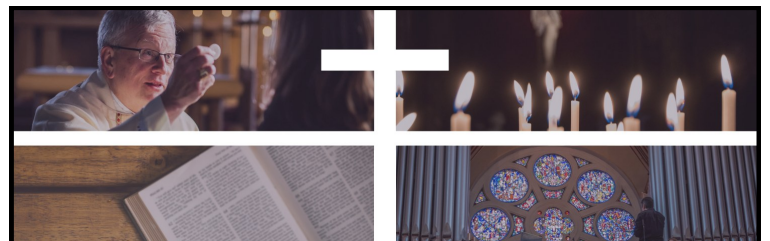
**Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Training**

### Parish Records Update Needed



Many of the records in the parishioner database in the offices are in need of updates. There are many landline numbers that are no longer used. There are outdated email contacts. Many families have children who have grown up, are on their own, have their own family, or no longer live in the area but the children are listed with their parents.

After Masses on March 22 & 23, March 29 & 30, and April 5 & 6, volunteers will be at the back each church with a printout of your current record. You are asked to review it and make the changes. New information will then be entered into the office database.

Children may remain on the parent's record until age 26 (per GB Diocese guidelines). At 26 years old, you are asked to register independently. If you have not previously registered, we'd love for you to become a register member. Please take time to complete a parishioner registration form. Forms will be available from the volunteers.

Each parish will have the print outs at their respective parishes. Please make time to provide us with the update. All parishioners whose records are not updated at Mass will need to be contacted in another way. Help us save time and extra steps.

- Family members who are currently active or inactive
- Residential address (and mailing address, if different)
- Landline number (if applicable)
- Cell phone numbers for adults in household
- Primary household email address
- Email addresses for adults in household (especially if serving in ministry or on a committee)
