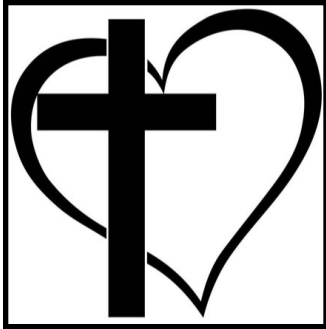

Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: Much has been made of the image of Jesus as Good Shepherd. This short gospel from John gets at the heart of it. Being a sheep in Christ's fold involves three things: hearing his voice, being known by him, and following him. There is a relational exchange implied in each of these: he calls, we listen; he knows us, we know him; he leads, we follow. His attentive love flows from the love of the Father, who made us and gave us to Jesus' care. And his love sustains us, providing not just for the immediate needs of this life but for our ultimate aim of eternal life with him.

To Experience: The image of God as a shepherd comes down to a sense of belonging. Sheep belong to a shepherd in a more utilitarian way; a shepherd cares for sheep so that they can eventually provide wool or meat. God cares for us, though, not to use us but simply out of love. God's love gives of God's self and deserves our trust, and also teaches us something about how we ought to love others.

1. How do you hear the voice of Jesus?
2. How well do you feel Jesus knows you? Do you ever struggle to bring your full self to him in prayer?
3. Which parts of following Jesus are easy for you? Which present a challenge at this point in your life?

A FORGOTTEN SACRAMENT

Today I would like to bring up the Sacrament Anointing of the Sick. I believe it's the forgotten Sacrament. People forget to ask for this sacrament or they are under the wrong impression when they should ask for it.

Anointing of the Sick was recognized by the Church as Christ's seventh Sacrament around 250 AD. This Sacrament is Scriptural; we find the basis of it in James 5:14-15. "Is any of you sick? Let them call for the elders of the Church, let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven." (See also Mark 6:13 and Matt. 8:17.)

In the past this Sacrament was thought to be used only when a person was near death. It should be asked for at that time, but the faithful can ask a priest to administer this sacrament when they are having surgery, diagnosed with major illness, have an ongoing health condition, old age, or when facing the end of life (enters hospice). Catholics may receive this sacrament more than once in their lives.

This Sacrament is administered to bring about a spiritual healing, to give a person Christ's peace so they can endure their cross. This is a critical gift. Anointing of the Sick also gives the person physical strength and healing. This Sacrament always gives graces and gifts of the Holy Spirit. It helps fight against anxiety, discouragement, and temptation. It will also convey peace and fortitude (CCC 1520).

If you are praying and are anointed in hopes of being physically healed and God doesn't heal you, do not be discouraged. It doesn't mean your faith is weak. It doesn't mean God doesn't care about you. Yet, we wonder, "Why doesn't God heal me?" We have to realize that we are made to suffer, since mankind's fall from God's Grace. Even Christ suffered, so we too suffer. Sometimes, we suffer for sanctification. St. Paul writes, "Therefore that I might not become too elated a thorn in my flesh was given to me, an angel of satan, to beat me. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me. But He said to me, 'My Grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness' (2 Cor. 12:7-9). Scripture also tells us, "It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons, for what son is there that the Father does not discipline?" (Heb. 12:7, 11). As with all things we have to realize it is God's will before our own.

When this Sacrament is used for "Last Rites" it does several things. It prepares us for the Journey Home. The sacrament includes confession and forgiveness of sins. An Apostolic Pardon may be granted without confession if the sick person is unable to make a confession. They may also receive the Sacrament of Confirmation if they had not previously been confirmed. Viaticum, (Communion) is given as Food for the Journey which will prepare them to travel to the Lord. This is a beautiful sacrament, so call a priest right away.

Let us not forget this wonderful Sacrament that can give us so many graces. It not only helps us for our journey to heaven, but it can help us as we journey through life here on earth.

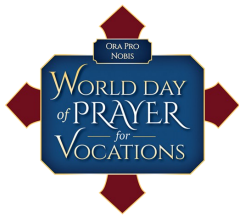
