### Thoughts for Today's Readings

**To the Point:** This poignant passage reiterates, as so much of the gospel does, that God's ways are not our ways. Without the protection and status of husband or sons, widows were left vulnerable to poverty and social exclusion. This widow faces those conditions bravely, enters the temple to offer what she can, and is commended by Jesus for her generosity. She makes a gift that seems small to those around her. She herself probably perceived this as a small gift, even though she alone knew how hard it would make her life. And yet this brief moment has been noticed and memorialized, celebrated all these thousands of years later. We, likewise, do not know what impact our sacrifices and generosity have. Things that might seem small or meaningless are noticed by God and taken up into the bigger project of bringing about God's vision of justice and love.

**To Experience:** The widow's agency in this story reminds us that "the poor" are not some passive group of people awaiting our generosity and care. People who are poor are *people*. They have families and friends. They have stories and dreams. They have callings and gifts; they are called to and capable of generosity. An awareness of their personhood and agency should permeate all our attempts to serve them.

1. Jesus points out the difference between giving from one's surplus wealth and making a sacrificial gift. Where might you be able to make a sacrifice in order to support someone struggling with poverty?
2. In the first reading, God miraculously provides for a woman living in poverty. More often, God provides through the work of God's people. How might you participate in God's care for those in need?

My dear friends in Jesus Christ!

As we reflect on the Gospel for the 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, we encounter Jesus' teaching on generosity and humility through the story of the widow's offering. While others gave from their abundance, this poor widow offered two small coins- everything she had to live on. Jesus observed her, not with pity, but with admiration for her deep trust in God. Her gift was small by worldly standards, yet it held immense value in God's eyes.

This passage invites us to examine our own giving. In a society that often measures generosity by size or display, Jesus turns our attention to the heart of giving. The widow's offering shows us that God looks not at the amount but at the love, faith, and sacrifice behind it. True generosity flows from a heart fully trusting in God, willing to give without counting the cost, because it understands that everything we have is a gift from Him.

As we journey together as one family with two homes (St. Gregory and Holy Trinity), let's ask ourselves: Are we giving God the best of our time, talent, and the resources, or only what's left over? Are we willing to step out in faith, even when it feels uncomfortable? Like the widow, may we embrace a spirit of radical trust and generosity.

May this week inspire us all to deepen our faith in God's providence and find new ways to offer our lives more fully to Him. Whether through acts of kindness, volunteering, or supporting our parish, let's remember that every small act of love counts in the Kingdom of God.

Each time I walk past the Tree of Souls in the Church, I am reminded to lift my heart in prayer for all the departed.

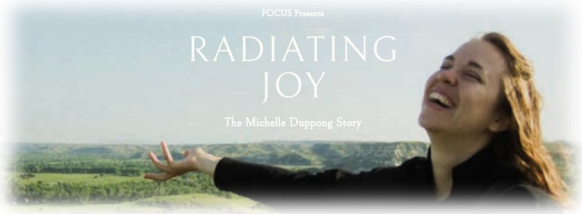

**Veterans Day Facts**



1. Veterans Day is a day to honor all veterans—so no apostrophe needed.

2. Veterans Day is NOT the same as Memorial Day. Memorial Day is a time to remember those who gave their lives for our country, particularly in battle or from wounds they suffered in battle. Veterans Day honors all of those who have served the country in war and peace—dead or alive—although it's largely intended to thank living veterans for their sacrifices.

3. Veterans Day was originally called Armistice Day, commemorating the end of World War I. World War I officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919. However, the fighting ended about seven months before that when the Allies and Germany put into effect an armistice on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, Nov. 11, 1918, was largely considered the end of "the war to end all wars" and dubbed Armistice Day. In 1926, Congress officially recognized it as the end of the war, and in 1938, it became an official holiday, primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I. But then World War II and the Korean War happened, so on June 1, 1954, at the urging of veterans service organizations, Congress amended the commemoration yet again by changing the word "armistice" to "veterans" so the day would honor American veterans of all wars.

**The Tree of Souls:  
Remembering Our Departed Loved Ones in November**

As the month of November approaches, it is a time in the Church dedicated to praying for the souls of those who departed from this life. To help us remember our loved ones, we introduce the Tree of Souls – a beautiful symbol where we hang the names of family members, friends, and all those who have gone before us. This tree stands as a reminder of our connection to them and our duty to pray for their eternal rest.

The Tree of Souls is not just a decoration; it represents life, memory, and hope. In the Bible, trees are often symbols of life and growth. As we write the names of our loved ones and place them on the tree, we are reminded of their lives and the impact they had on us. This simple act of placing their names on the tree becomes a form of prayer, lifting their souls up to God.

The entire month of November, however, is traditionally set aside to pray for the souls in purgatory, asking God to grant them eternal peace. As students, you may have family members or friends who have passed away. Praying for them, as well as for those who have no one to pray for them, is a loving and merciful act.

Participating in the tree of souls is simple yet meaningful. You can write down the names of those who have passed away – whether family, friends, or others you want to pray for – and place the names on the tree. As you do so, take a moment to pray for them. Your prayers can be short and from the heart. You might say something like:  
“Lord, I pray for (name), that you may forgive their sins and grant them eternal rest in Your presence. Amen.”

The Tree of Souls reminds us that love never dies, and neither does our connection to those who have gone before us. By praying for them, we help them on their journey to eternal life and keep their memory alive in our hearts.

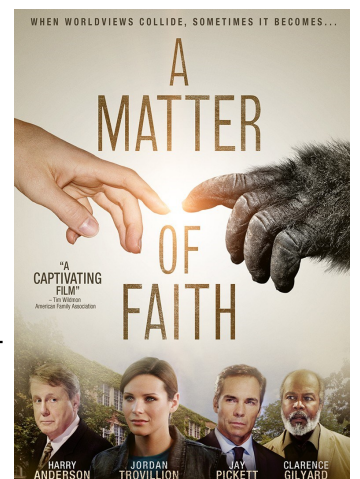
