Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: The scribe who asks Jesus about the greatest commandment is an interesting character. It is hard to get a read on him: this kind of question, from a scribe, is usually intended as a trick for Jesus. His response, though, is one of sincere acceptance, showing an understanding that earns Jesus' approval. Perhaps his question, then, was not a trick but one of an earnest seeker striving after God in love. Jesus' response gives two commandments rooted in love; perhaps the scribe's recognition of the truth in Jesus' answer came from a heart already shaped by genuine love for God and neighbor. In any event, this gospel reminds us that many of our human boundaries fall apart in the face of the God who calls us to love. Jesus and the scribe—usually adversaries—here understand each other and are able to engage in honest dialogue.

To Experience: Love for neighbor and love for God are two sides of the same coin. Where one is truly found, so is found the other. Those of us how are interested and involved in ministry cannot engage in churchy affairs as one hobby among many. We, like all believers, are called to let ourselves be transformed by our encounter with Christ. Our love for God is evidenced by the way we treat those around us.

1. If you had the opportunity to ask Jesus a question like the scribe does, what would you ask him?
2. How do you most powerfully experience the love of God? Where do you need help in cultivating an awareness of God's presence?
3. How do you show your love for God in how you live your daily life?

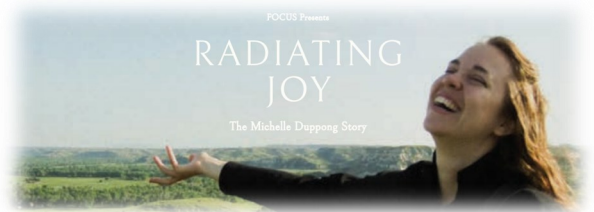



**The Tree of Souls:
Remembering Our Departed Loved Ones in November**

As the month of November approaches, it is a time in the Church dedicated to praying for the souls of those who departed from this life. To help us remember our loved ones, we introduce the Tree of Souls – a beautiful symbol where we hang the names of family members, friends, and all those who have gone before us. This tree stands as a reminder of our connection to them and our duty to pray for their eternal rest.

The Tree of Souls is not just a decoration; it represents life, memory, and hope. In the Bible, trees are often symbols of life and growth. As we write the names of our loved ones and place them on the tree, we are reminded of their lives and the impact they had on us. This simple act of placing their names on the tree becomes a form of prayer, lifting their souls up to God.

The entire month of November, however, is traditionally set aside to pray for the souls in purgatory, asking God to grant them eternal peace. As students, you may have family members or friends who have passed away. Praying for them, as well as for those who have no one to pray for them, is a loving and merciful act.

Participating in the tree of souls is simple yet meaningful. The Tree of Souls reminds us that love never dies, and neither does our connection to those who have gone before us. By praying for them, we help them on their journey to eternal life and keep their memory alive in our hearts.

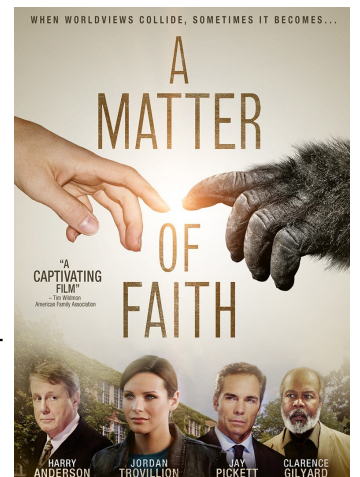
