Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: In this parable, Jesus is not encouraging us to live like the tax collectors of his time – who would steal from those whose taxes they collected – but is reminding us that we are all more alike than we sometimes care

to admit. The Pharisee's mistake is not praying or fasting or paying tithes; it is believing that doing these things makes him different from, and better than, his fellow human beings. The tax collector is doing wrong, and Jesus does not condone his actions. But what he gets right is his standing in relation to God. He knows he is a sinner and he knows he needs God's mercy. This is true of all of us, no matter how well we pray or how generous we are. It is always God who saves us, not ourselves.

To Experience: It is hard work to maintain humility. Our human natures are all too ready to take credit for the good that we do. We want to believe that we have earned God's favor and all the good things God gives us. It is through disciplines – regular, repeated acts of prayer and fasting and generosity, even when we don't feel like doing them – that we can grow into and maintain a rightly ordered relationship with God.

- 1. How do you work to cultivate a spirit of humility? What disciplines help you remember God as creator and you as creation?
- 2. How have you witnessed God provide for you in the past? How could that help you remember your dependence on God?
- 3. This gospel reminds us that God often subverts our expectations. Think about a time when God surprised you, showing up in an unexpected person or place.

Hear to Serve....

I do not have all the answers. When it comes to our faith and teachings of the Church, there is a lot I do not know. I really wish that were not the case. I would love to be able to write a homily, a bulletin column, or have a marriage preparation session where all the answers would just be there. I wish I could look at the weekly readings and just know how they all work together. I wish I could be eloquent, saying things in just the right way. I would love to be like St. Peter and have my words bring thousands to Christ. I am not St. Peter. I am not meant to be St. Peter. But even St. Peter was not always that St. Peter.

All of us have experienced a time when all our efforts come together just right. Someone asks us a question or comes to us for advice, and we are able to give just the right answer. The family gathering or party we spent so much time preparing for was picture perfect. Sometimes it is like this for Mass. When the homily, music, incense, flowers, and everything come together just right we can be moved by the perfectness. We are elated and feel that if we practice even a little harder next year, or plan even more, we could get even better results.

I must be honest. I want to do a good job. I do not want to disappoint Jesus. But where I meet Christ is not in these triumphs; I meet Christ in the struggle. Jesus is there in my most humbling moments of doubt. He is there in my most embarrassing admissions in Confession. Jesus is there when I say, "I do not know," especially when others think I should know.

Jesus is also at the Mass where the lector stumbles over a few words but goes on. He is there when kids cry or do not want to stay in one place. He is also there when the server rings the bell too early or when the message of the homily is a tough one to hear.

It is in the imperfect times that we know it is not about us. We are not the ones who have the perfect words, the perfect performance, the perfect lives. We do not even have the perfect prayer. We are the ones who are broken, confused, complacent, tired, and blind to so many of our sins. We are the ones who see the worst in others before seeing the worst in ourselves and our need for our Lord and Savior.

There is good news. There is hope because it is when we realize how spiritually poor we really are just like the tax collector, that's when Christ hears us and heals us. It is in these moments when we admit that we really do not know that we can be open to what He wants to teach us. What God wants for us is so much more than what we are convinced we need. It is when we are finally humble that Jesus lifts our hearts, minds, attentions, and actions up to our Heavenly Father.

Lord, when I do not know...I trust that you do. When I cannot...I trust that through you, I can.



The Tree of Souls: Remembering Our Departed Loved Ones in November

As the month of November approaches, it is a time in the Church dedicated to praying for the souls of those who departed from this life. To help us remember our loved ones, we reinstate

the Tree of Souls – a beautiful symbol where we hang the names of family members, friends, and all those who have gone before us. This tree stands as a reminder of our connection to them and our duty to pray for their eternal rest.

The Meaning of the Tree of Souls

The Tree of Souls is not just a decoration; it represents life, memory, and hope. In the Bible, trees are often symbols of life and growth. As we write the names of our loved ones and place them on the tree, we are reminded of their lives and the impact they had on us. This simple act of placing their names on the tree becomes a form of prayer, lifting their souls up to God.

In the Bible, we read about the importance of praying for the dead. In 2 Maccabees 12:45, it says, "It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." Why November?

Another beautiful passage is from Psalm 23:4, "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me." This verse reminds us that God is always with us, even in our moments of grief and sorrow.

How to Participate in the Tree of Souls


Participating in the Tree of Souls is simple yet meaningful. You can write down the names of those who have passed away – whether family, friends, or others you want to pray for – and place the names on the tree. As you do so, take a moment to pray for them. Your prayers can be short and from the heart. You might say something like:

"Lord, I pray for (name), that you may forgive their sins and grant them eternal rest in Your presence. Amen."

A Call to Pray

Friends, praying for the dead is an act of love and mercy that connects us with the whole Church, both the living and those who have passed on. Remember what Jesus said in Matthew 5:7, "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy." Let us show mercy through our prayers, trusting that our departed loved ones are resting in the arms of God.

The Tree of Souls reminds us that love never dies, and neither does our connection to those who have gone before us. By praying for them, we help them on their journey to eternal life and keep their memory alive in our hearts.


