



#### **Thoughts for Today's Readings**



**To the Point:** The gospel is always hard to hear. Jesus' call to hate our own family goes against our natural instincts to love and protect

and honor them. These instincts are *good*, put in place by God. They are part of how God loves us in this life, by enabling us to share love with each other. But being a follower of Christ means transcending the natural affection that families share. It means participating in God's love such that there are no favored ones among us. It means loving all as God does, equally and fully. Our human loves find their completion in the love of God, which does not divide or have preferences even as it loves each of us individually. This transcendent, all-encompassing love does not erase our human loves but perfects them.

**To Experience:** Renouncing all our possessions seems like a tall order in today's materialistic society. We like our things; they provide us with safety and security and fun. We stockpile things "for a rainy day," preparing ourselves against the worst. This isn't all bad, but it can lead to overreliance on ourselves. God asks us instead to rely fully on God. God wants our whole hearts and our full trust.

- 1. What crosses are you carrying these days? How can your community support you in bearing them?
- 2. What possessions might you be overly attached to? How can you practice detachment from your things in order to free yourself to follow Christ?

Dear Friends in Christ.

This single verse speaks volumes. When I read the Gospel of the twenty third Sunday in ordinary time, I was touched by the first verse of the Gospel itself. The important words like "With Jesus", "Traveling", and "Great crowds" in this verse made me reflect on keeping Christ at the center, living faith as a journey, and walking together as a community of believers. In the passage, we also find that Jesus invites His followers to take up the cross and follow Him. This is a personal invitation to all the followers of Jesus, to sacrifice and commitment. But "Great crowds were traveling with Jesus" highlights His unique charisma — how His very presence drew people together into a community eager to walk the journey with Him.

Jesus was not alone on the road – He was surrounded by people. His presence, His words, and His very life had a charisma that drew hearts close. People longed to be with Him, to listen to Him, and to walk alongside Him.


We, too, are part of that "great crowd" today. As parishioners, we are not individuals walking our own paths – we are a community traveling with Jesus. To "travel with Him" means more than simply admiring Him from a distance. It means listening carefully, learning from Him, and allowing His teachings to shape our lives.

The beauty of the Gospel is that it invites us into motion. Faith is a journey, not a stop. Like the first disciples and the great crowds, we are called to take the next step: to follow Jesus more closely, to bring others along, and to keep our eyes fixed on Him even when the road feels long.

This week, let us ask ourselves: Am I simply part of the crowd, or am I truly traveling with Jesus? If we journey with Him wholeheartedly, then our parish, too, becomes a living sign of His presence – where faith, hope, and love are always moving forward.

Let us continue this journey together, with Jesus leading the way.




#### Second Collection – This Weekend September 6 & 7

# Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Monday, September 8



The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8.

Scripture does not give an account of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. However, the apocryphal *Protoevangelium of James* fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning.

Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation and asks for an increase of peace.

#### Reflection

We can see every human birth as a call for new hope in the world. The love of two human beings has joined with God in his creative work. The loving parents have shown hope in a world filled with travail. The new child has the potential to be a channel of God's love and peace to the world.

This is all true in a magnificent way in Mary. If Jesus is the perfect expression of God's love, Mary is the foreshadowing of that love. If Jesus has brought the fullness of salvation, Mary is its dawning.

Birthday celebrations bring happiness to the celebrant as well as to family and friends. Next to the birth of Jesus, Mary's birth offers the greatest possible happiness to the world. Each time we celebrate her birth, we can confidently hope for an increase of peace in our hearts and in the world at large.




