Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In this gospel, Jesus gives a chilling account of the end times – there will be

false prophets to resist, wars to survive, natural disasters to outlive, and persecutions to endure. This is the end for which Jesus often admonishes us to "stay awake" and "be ready." Almost in contrast to that, though, this gospel tells us not to go to our interrogations *too* prepared, because Jesus will be with us all the while. It is he who will speak through us, providing wisdom and salvation even when all seems lost. We will need to provide perseverance in the face of all these adverse events, but we never need to fear we will face them alone.

To Experience: Whether the end times are near or not, all of us face trials in this life. There are many alluring voices that we are called to resist. Tragedies of all kinds touch everyone at some point. Even very privileged lives are not immune to suffering. Just as he promises to be with us in the end times, Jesus is with us in all of this too.

- 1. What trials have you faced in your life? How have you found God present with you in the midst of suffering?
- 2. The devastation of the eschaton does not exist for its own sake but is to make room for God to come in and rule the earth once and for all. Where do you see God already present in the world?
- 3. How could you help make a little more room for God in the world and in your heart?

A Message of Hope in Troubled Times

Dear Friends in Christ,

We are living in an unpredictable and unstable world. When we see the headlines, hear of conflicts, or face personal trials, it's easy for our hearts to be gripped by fear. Two thousand years ago, Jesus' disciples marveled at the grandeur of the Temple, a symbol of stability and divine presence. Jesus, with profound wisdom, shifted their perspective, reminding them that the grandest human structures are temporary.

Jesus doesn't just predict trouble in this passage; He provides a roadmap for navigating it with faith, resilience, and hope. He wants us to move beyond fear and into a secure trust in God's unwavering presence.

The important statements of Jesus in this passage talks about the truths He revealed.

1. Do Not Be Terrified by World Events

Jesus warns that we will hear of wars, natural disasters, and global turmoil. He tells us these things "must first take place," but they are not the end. When chaos erupts around us, our instruction is simple: **Do not panic.** These events are not a sign that God has lost control; they are a call for us to anchor our hope in the One who remains the same yesterday, today, and forever.

2. Persecution is Our Platform

Jesus promises that following Him will bring opposition. We may be arrested, brought before authorities, and even betrayed by those closest to us. While this sounds frightening, Jesus flips the script: persecution is an **opportunity to bear witness**.


3. Our Endurance Secures Our Life

Perhaps the most comforting promise in this passage comes with a hard truth: some may face death for their faith. Yet Jesus gives a profound assurance: "not a hair of your head will perish." Physical death is not the final word. Our ultimate security lies in God's eternal safekeeping of our souls.

The world around us may shake, but the foundation we stand on in Christ is secure. Let us not place our hope in temporary human structures or worldly systems, but in the living God who holds the future.

Stay steadfast. Trust His presence. Your endurance is a powerful testament to His faithfulness, and in Him, your future is secure.

The Tree of Souls: Remembering Our Departed Loved Ones in November

Participating in the Tree of Souls is simple yet meaningful. You can write down the names of those who have passed away – whether family, friends, or others you want to pray for – and

place the names on the tree. As you do so, take a moment to pray for them. Your prayers can be short and from the heart. You might say something like:

"Lord, I pray for (name), that you may forgive their sins and grant them eternal rest in Your presence. Amen."

The Tree of Souls reminds us that love never dies, and neither does our connection to those who have gone before us. By praying for them, we help them on their journey to eternal life and keep their memories alive in our hearts.

The Story of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary November 21

Mary's presentation was celebrated in Jerusalem in the sixth century. A church was built there in honor of this mystery. The Eastern Church was more interested in the feast, but it does appear in the West in the 11th century. Although the feast at times disappeared from the calendar, in the 16th century it became a feast of the universal Church.

As with Mary's birth, we read of Mary's presentation in the temple only in apocryphal literature. In what is recognized as an unhistorical account, the *Protoevangelium of James* tells us that Anna and Joachim offered Mary to God in the Temple when she was 3 years old. This was to carry out a promise made to God when Anna was still childless.

Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the birth of Mary. It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond.

Reflection

It is sometimes difficult for modern Westerners to appreciate a feast like this. The Eastern Church, however, was quite open to this feast and even somewhat insistent about celebrating it. Even though the feast has no basis in history, it stresses an important truth about Mary: From the beginning of her life, she was dedicated to God. She herself became a greater temple than any made by hands.

God came to dwell in her in a marvelous manner and sanctified her for her unique role in God's saving work. At the same time, the magnificence of Mary enriches her children. They—we—too are temples of God and sanctified in order that we might enjoy and share in God's saving work.


