### Divine Mercy: From Doubting to Devotion

In today's Gospel, we look at the powerful moment the Risen Lord breathes the Holy Spirit upon His Apostles, instituting the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**.

With the words, "*Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven,*" Jesus establishes a direct channel for His Divine Mercy to reach every soul. Even when faced with the doubt of St. Thomas, Jesus does not turn away; instead, He invites Thomas to touch His wounds, leading to the profound profession of faith: "**My Lord and my God!**"

#### Two Lessons for Our Journey:

1. **Receive and Reflect Mercy:** We celebrate God's mercy through the Mass, Confession, and Adoration. But receiving it is only half the journey. We are called to "practice what we receive" through **Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy**. By showing mercy to others in our daily lives, we prepare ourselves for God's merciful judgment.
2. **Cultivate a Living Faith:** A dynamic faith isn't passive; it is a self-surrender that leads to **agape love**. To grow in the faith of St. Thomas, the spiritual Fathers recommend:
  - **Knowing Jesus** through daily, meditative Scripture reading.
  - **Strengthening Faith** through personal and communal prayer.
  - **Sharing Divine Life** by frequently receiving the Eucharist and Reconciliation.

As **St. Teresa of Calcutta** taught, prayer leads to belief, belief to love, and love to service. Let us seek the grace to see the Risen Lord in everyone we encounter this week.

### Thoughts for Today's Readings



**To the Point:** It's incredibly unfortunate that we mostly know "Doubting Thomas" for the first half of this gospel story rather than for the proclamation of Jesus' identity. Apart from Peter's response to Jesus in Matthew 16:16 (You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God"), one would be hard-pressed to find a more succinct, powerful, and personal witness to Jesus. Of course, it took some time and experience of Jesus for Thomas to get there. Like the other disciples who gathered in the locked room, Thomas needed a personal encounter with the risen Jesus. However, he wanted this encounter on his own terms – "Unless I see ... I will not believe." In his generosity, Jesus meets Thomas in exactly this way, but also challenges him by saying, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." This challenge to Thomas is also a fourth wall-breaking encouragement to those hearing the gospel at the time of its writing and to all of us today, who rely primarily on the experience of Jesus written down in the Scriptures. Insofar as we can proclaim Jesus crucified and risen, we are truly blessed.

**To Experience:** The apostle Thomas is a figure that many of us can relate to. For something as outlandish as the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, it's natural to want "proof." *If only I could see Jesus, I would believe. If only I could have my questions answered, I would believe. If only ...* Faith is not separate from doubt. As the author of the Letter to the Hebrews writes, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (11:1). Thomas's faith is not less because of his doubt; nor is ours. Faith allows us to see a glimpse of God, even in our doubts and fears. "I do believe, help my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24).

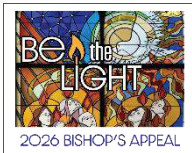
