Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: Jesus' response to the Canaanite woman in this Sunday's gospel is particularly troubling. If Jesus is truly God and love itself, how could he ignore her, and then refer to her as a dog? To be both a Canaanite and a woman and to address Jesus directly would have been crossing incredible social boundaries; the apostles wanted to send her away. Throughout Matthew's Gospel, Jesus sees his mission as only to the "lost sheep of the house of Israel," and he says as much here. The Canaanite woman recognizes him as the Messiah for the Jewish people, addressing Jesus as "Son of David." Even in spite of Jesus' initial refusal to address her and subsequent dismissal, she persists in her request, trusting that Jesus is who he says he is. Finally, Jesus recognizes her great faith and grants her request. At the end of Matthew's Gospel (28:19), Jesus tells the disciples to go out to all nations. The Canaanite woman's encounter with Jesus gives a glimpse into the future of Jesus' mission, while giving us an example of faith to look up to and a reminder that no one is excluded from God's love.

To Experience: Few words characterize our world today more accurately than "divided". We are divided by class, by race, by political affiliation, by gender, age, and sexuality. We identify with those similar to ourselves and separate those who are different, whether by force or more subtly. Entrenched differences in socioeconomic status and historical discrimination make these boundaries all the more acute. Over 60 years ago, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. remarked that 11am on Sunday is the "most segregated hour in this nation." While this has changed some, there is still much work to do in making our worship communities a welcoming place for all people. Faith in the universality of the church requires us to continue to break down barriers, especially in our own communities, welcoming diversity of all kinds while holding onto unity in the one Christ.

Encountering the Living Word

We witness the remarkable persistence of the Canaanite woman in today's Gospel. St. Mark gently refers to her as "Syrophenician" to highlight her cultural background, but



St. Matthew intentionally calls her a "Canaanite." This specific word evokes generations of ancient biblical rivalry, amplifying the immense cultural and religious divide she had to cross to reach Jesus.

This historic breakthrough directly mirrors what we experience every day during the Liturgy of the Word. From the First Reading to the Prayer of the Faithful, the "breaking of the Word" is not an academic lecture or a performance show—it is an intimate space where God gives Himself to us. The Bible is not a dead artifact; it is alive today, offering real answers to our most modern struggles.

Active Preparation: We are invited to practice *Lectio Divina** by reading the scriptures slowly at home before arriving at Mass.

Reverent Delivery: Lectors are called to prepare deeply, anchoring their service in spiritual reverence and intentional posture, rather than public talent.

Sacred Space: We use incense during the Gospel to visually honor Christ truly present in the Word, while the intentional breaks and silence between readings allow the Holy Spirit to echo deep within our hearts.

After digesting this living Word, we stand to declare our shared faith through the Nicene Creed and lift the needs of our world in the Prayer of the Faithful.

One by One Campaign & Narthex Project Update

St. Gregory Parish has received approval from the Diocese to proceed with the Narthex project. Bishop David Ricken signed his approval after a thorough review by the Diocesan Offices of Facilities and Properties, Divine Worship, and Finance and Accounting.

The Narthex, an approved one by One project, is designed to define a gathering and social space from the worship space (nave). The nave is where reverence for our Lord is paramount and must be observed with prayer and silence and in respect to those in prayer.

The funds for this project have been held in a separate account designated for one by One Campaign projects and are available to cover project costs.

We are in the process of informing those contractors who have been selected and approved by the Parish and Finance Councils to perform the work.

Gerard Hall, Director of Divine Worship for the Diocese, has visited our church twice regarding this project. He felt that creating the narthex would be positive in changing and realigning the space into what it should be, realizing a significant improvement from the appearance and function of today. He requested to be invited back after completion of the project!

It is anticipated but not yet confirmed that the actual building portion of the project will begin in January of 2027.

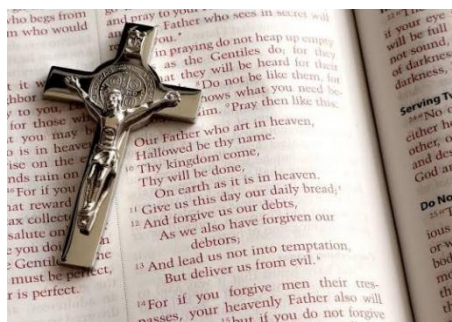

What is Lectio Divina?



Lectio Divina, Latin for divine reading, draws us closer to the Lord by finding a new way to immerse us in Scripture. With roots as far back as Saint Gregory of Nyssa (c 330-395) and Saint Benedict of Nursia (c 480-

597), who founded the Benedictines, Lectio Divina involves reading a text from Scripture multiple times and allowing the Holy Spirit to open our hearts to God's message.

How do I pray?

To begin, get ready to pray. Choose a short Scripture passage or story, such as one of the day's readings, and find a quiet place. Light a candle, relax your body, and put away all distractions; do whatever helps you to pray.

Step One: Lectio (Read)

Read through your chosen passage the first time. What particular word, phrase, or image stands out to you?

Step Two: Meditatio (Reflect)

Read through the text a second time, focusing again on the parts that stood out to you. What might God be saying to you?

Step Three: Oratio (Respond)

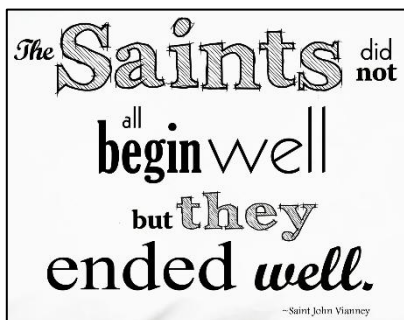
Read the text a third time, and then jump right into a conversation with God. You could journal, or simply pray in silence if you prefer, but talk with God about how the message you found in the text relates to your life. Pray for God's help.

Step Four: Contemplatio (Rest)

Read the text for a final time, and spend time in silence with the Lord. Allow God to speak to you in the silence of your heart. If you become distracted, don't get agitated: just draw your attention back to the Scripture passage and be still once again.

Finally, thank God for speaking to you through this prayer experience. As always, pray for His will to be done in your life.

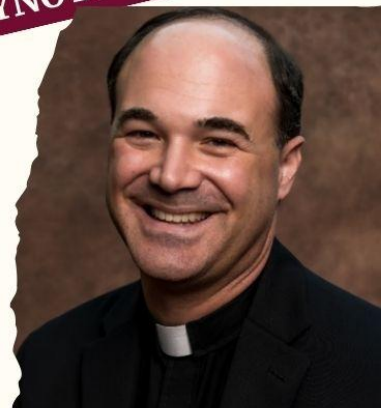
