Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Peter correctly identifies who Jesus is, but Jesus in turn instructs him and the other disciples to tell this to no one, keeping the “messianic secret.” At this time, the Twelve are the few privileged recipients of this revelation; for the rest, they must come to know Jesus in the context that he decides. This context is made clear immediately thereafter, as Jesus looks ahead to his own passion, death, and resurrection. The paschal mystery is to be the lens through which the whole of Jesus’ ministry is to be interpreted – the total and public revelation of who Jesus is, the Son of God sent for us. After the resurrection of Jesus, his ministry of healing and forgiveness finds its locus in Peter, the “rock”. The church’s responsibility in communion with the authority of Peter is to proclaim Jesus’ death and resurrection and to make him present in word and sacrament, exercising the ministries of “binding” and “loosing” to shepherd the people of God.

To Experience: Both the Davidic monarchy in ancient times and the clerical leadership of the church over the past two millennia have demonstrated serious faults, despite guiding divinely authorized institutions. We might not know why God allowed certain people to hold kingship over his people of leadership over his church. But in spite of human inadequacy, we can hold faith in the church because it is ultimately Jesus’ church, not ours. Jesus promises that “the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it.” If we cannot trust the words of Jesus himself, to whom shall we go?

1. How has the church’s ministry of “loosing” sins in the sacrament of reconciliation played a role in your spiritual journey?

Beyond Human Understanding

Jesus asks His disciples a piercing question: “*Who do you say that I am?*”

Simon Peter answers, “*You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.*”

Jesus’ response to Peter contains a powerful spiritual truth: “Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father.”

With these words, Jesus reminds us that true faith is not a product of human logic, academic study, or mere guesswork. Intellectual efforts alone (“flesh and blood”) cannot unlock the deep mystery of God. Instead, knowing Jesus intimately requires divine revelation, a direct gift that flows straight from the heart of the Father.

How do we open our hearts to receive this heavenly revelation?

It does not happen by accident, nor can it survive on a casual, once-in-a-while faith. True spiritual insight requires a constant, intentional encounter with our Heavenly Father.

The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary Saturday, August 22

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the Blessed Virgin Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.

In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical *To the Queen of Heaven*, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.

Reflection:

As Saint Paul suggests in Romans 8:28–30, God has predestined human beings from all eternity to share the image of his Son. All the more was Mary predestined to be the mother of Jesus. As Jesus was to be king of all creation, Mary, in dependence on Jesus, was to be queen. All other titles to queenship derive from this eternal intention of God. As Jesus exercised his kingship on earth by serving his Father and his fellow human beings, so did Mary exercise her queenship. As the glorified Jesus remains with us as our

king till the end of time (Matthew 28:20), so does Mary, who was assumed into heaven and crowned queen of heaven and earth.

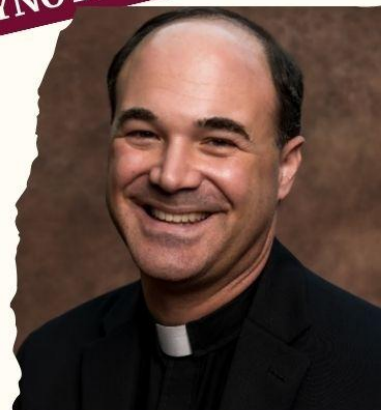
