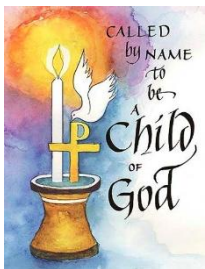
Little Books (Advent, Lent, Easter)

The Sacrifice of the Cross Made Present

In the Gospel, Jesus reveals to His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, suffer greatly, and be killed. Peter tries to stop Him, but Jesus firmly replies, "*Get behind me, Satan!*" He reminds us that saving our lives means losing them for His sake.



We encounter this ultimate sacrifice of love at every Mass during the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Just as Jesus broke His body on the Cross, He breaks Himself for us in the breaking of the bread.

The Elevation

When the priest lifts up the consecrated Host and Chalice, the bread and wine are no longer ordinary food. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, they truly become the Body, Blood,

Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

What Happens Spiritually?

Calvary is Present: The sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross is made present to us right now on the altar.

Heaven Meets Earth: The veil between heaven and earth drops, and we join the angels in worship.

What Should We Do?

- **Gaze with Love:** Look directly at the elevated Host and Chalice with profound reverence.
- **Pray Silently:** Say a prayer of faith in your heart, such as, "*My Lord and my God!*" or "*Jesus, I trust in You.*"
- **Bow in Reverence:** Profoundly bow your head when the priest genuflects after the elevation.

After Receiving Communion

Receiving Holy Communion is the most intimate moment of our day. We become living tabernacles, holding the Creator of the universe inside us.

What to Do in the Pew?

- **Offer Thanksgiving:** Do not immediately look around or check out mentally. Spend 5 to 10 minutes in deep, silent prayer thanking Jesus for entering your heart.
- **Sing the Communion Hymn:** Join your voice with the parish community to express unity and joy.

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Until now in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus has begun to reveal his identity by teaching and by signs. But after Peter proclaims him as the Christ, Jesus radically flips the disciples' expectations. Their beloved Christ must suffer and die at the hands of their own religious leaders. For anyone expecting a messiah restore the Davidic kingdom and establish peace, Jesus' example would not suffice. Jesus rebukes Peter with incredibly strong language, calling him "Satan" and "an obstacle" – especially contrasting giving Jesus' recent decision to name him "the rock." Peter's comments are reminiscent of Satan's temptation in the desert: Be an earthly king and escape death. In contrast, Jesus introduces the great paradox of the Christian life: "Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." In chapter 10 of Matthew, Jesus warns the disciples of the hardship they will face in proclaiming the gospel. Her in chapter 16, Jesus confirms that in suffering for the gospel, they will follow in his own example. If the disciples wish to receive the eternal life that Jesus promises, they must relinquish this temporal life and carry their crosses after him.

To Experience: We do not always want the messiah we got. Sometimes, we wish God would have sent someone to end global hunger and maintain world peace. At others, we, like the Zealots in Christ's day, wish we had a divinely authorized political leader who could "fix things" and put all those we disagree with in their place. God gave us neither. Instead, he sent us his Son, who became one of us and entered into our own suffering for us. To follow *that* Messiah is not always easy. It is uncomfortable, requires us to "turn the other cheek," and mandates that we stop grasping for control. But as Jesus said, "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

1. Jeremiah's prayer in the first reading is an incredibly honest dialogue with God. Are you able to have this same vulnerability in prayer? What keeps you from being open with God?

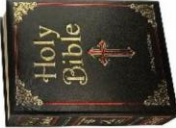

The Passion of St. John the Baptist - Feast Day: August 29

The Church celebrates the passion of St. John the Baptist who died approximately A.D. 30. We know from the Bible that he was the cousin of Jesus, the son of St. Elizabeth, and also the nephew of our Lady. King Herod knew that John was a holy man, and he liked to hear John's words, although he didn't take them to heart. He knew that he had to get control of him because of the crowds he was starting to build. He was afraid to kill him, so instead he had him imprisoned.

According to the Gospels, Herod had imprisoned John because he spoke out about Herod divorcing his wife, and unlawfully taking the wife of his brother.

Herod also feared that St. John's influence and power over the people might cause a rebellion. Over time, Herod had suffered military disaster at the hands of Aretas his father-in-law, and many believed it was God's punishment for his unrighteous behavior, and for taking the life of John the Baptist.

Practical Take Away

St. John the Baptist spoke the truth with great courage in calling others to a true change of heart, and to embrace the ways of God. He did this not only by preaching, but also by example. He fasted in the desert and prepared the way for Jesus. He had such a great courage, that he wasn't fearful of speaking out about the immoral activities of his day. This was the reasoning that led to his death, but he continued. We can learn a lot from his life. We too, can embrace the ways of God and speak out of the immorality of our day, and with the help of St. John the Baptist, we can prepare the way for Jesus to those around us.

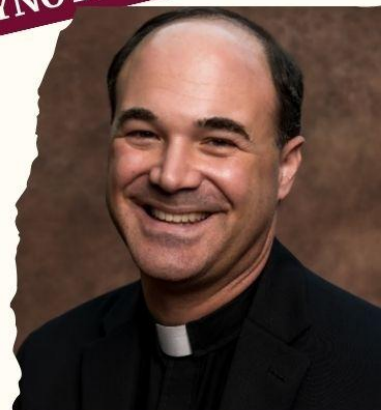
