



The Story of the Presentation of the Lord February 2

Under the Mosaic Law, a woman was ritually "unclean" for 40 days after childbirth, when she was to present herself to the priests and offer sacrifice—her "purification." Contact with anyone who had brushed against mystery—birth or death—excluded a person from Jewish worship. This feast emphasizes Jesus' first appearance in the Temple more than Mary's purification.

The observance spread throughout the Western Church in the fifth and sixth centuries. Because the Church in the West celebrated Jesus' birth on December 25, the Presentation was moved to February 2, 40 days after Christmas.

At the beginning of the eighth century, Pope Sergius inaugurated a candlelight procession; at the end of the same century the blessing and distribution of candles which continues to this day became part of the celebration, giving the feast its popular name: Candlemas.

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: In teaching from the mountain, Jesus signifies that he, like Moses, is the giver of God's authoritative law. Unlike Moses, however, Jesus claims that this teaching authority is his own. With the frequent use of the formula, "You have heard that it was said ... But I say to you ..." Jesus proclaims that he himself is the word of God. Within this Sermon on the Mount, the Beatitudes are the most essential proclamation of Jesus. They share the good news of the kingdom of heaven, which is good news especially for those who have little esteem in the eyes of the world – the meek, the merciful, the mourning, and the poor in spirit. Those who suffer for the sake of proclaiming this good news shall be rewarded greatly. If we share in the suffering and death of Christ, in solidarity with those who suffer in the world, we too shall share in his resurrection and life.

To Experience: The Beatitudes are some of the most consoling and encouraging words in the gospels, and a reminder of God's desire to care for us when we are at our most broken down. Life can be full of challenges, heartbreak, and drudgery. Jesus desires to meet us precisely in that slog, promising us that the kingdom of God is there. Trusting in the love and mercy of God, we can continue to follow the teachings of Jesus because we know that God will be with us in whatever difficulties life presents.

1. The second reading from Paul reminds us that God chooses the side of the poor and lowly, and Jesus proclaims that they will be blessed in God's kingdom. When has an encounter with someone in need brought you closer to God?

Hear to Serve...

Properly Disposed

We have often heard that Catholics need proper disposition to receive the sacraments. Without the right disposition, we might impede the flow of God's grace into our lives or even cause harm to our souls. Let's take a little time to reflect on what it means to be properly disposed.

The first component is to be in a **State of Grace**. God wants to share His life with us. In the Sacrament of Baptism, God washes away Original Sin and opens the gateway to a restored relationship with Him. However, through our fault, we fail and we sin. Our sins get in the way of us being able to receive what He is offering.

Faith is essential when approaching the Sacraments. It allows us to see beyond the rituals and recognize them as true channels of God's grace. Through faith, we understand that what God is offering us in a sacrament is really and truly being given to us. Believing in the power of the Sacraments transforms them from ancient traditions into living practices that bring us closer to God.

A genuine desire to grow in **holiness** is crucial. This longing draws us nearer to God and opens our hearts to the grace offered through the Sacraments. It is not merely about participating in a ceremony but yearning for a deeper spiritual connection and transformation.

Humility is necessary to understand the Sacraments as gifts from God. They are not something to be earned or a right to be claimed. With humility, we become more receptive to God's grace, acknowledging our dependence on His generosity and our need for His guidance.

Confidence in God's promises and the Sacraments' power nurtures hope within us. This confidence allows us to approach the Sacraments with an open heart, trusting in the transformative power they hold and the grace they impart.

Treating the Sacraments with **reverence and respect** is vital. This means paying attention during liturgies, being mindful of the sacredness of each moment, and approaching the Sacraments thoughtfully. Our actions, thoughts, and even our attire should reflect the profound respect we hold for these holy rites.

Receiving the Eucharist for the first time (or the 500th time) is a big deal. Jesus comes to dwell in us Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. In each sacrament, God pours His love and gifts into our souls. However, we must ask for these sacraments in a state of grace, with faith, humility, confidence, respect and with a genuine desire for holiness.




