Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Following the Beatitudes, where Jesus relies primarily on adjectives, Jesus here uses two nouns to share his message of the kingdom: salt and light. Both have a primordial quality to them; such images make for a strong proclamation. By using these images, Jesus speaks first of who we are. To be salt and to be light are characteristic of our greatest identity: children of our heavenly Father. From this identity, Jesus tells us what we are to do. Identity as children of God comes with a responsibility – to keep our “taste,” to shine before others. The way in which Jesus proclaims this message is key. He tells us of God’s great love for us before telling us to share that love. Hearing the word of God and living its response are intimately linked but two separate responsibilities, with one prior to the other. In proclaiming the love of God in the Scriptures, we cannot hope to hand on that which we have not yet received ourselves. Allow God to show you love, so that you might be more effective in proclaiming God’s love to those you encounter.

To Experience: What does it look like to “let your light shine?” Each of us is created by God as good, and that goodness takes many different forms, but a unifying truth is that the light we are given is meant to be given away. Perhaps it’s by caring for an aging parent or a young child. Maybe it’s by being thoughtful in friendships or spending time with people on the margins. Regardless of who we are, where we are, God asks us to share love with others, so that by our example they may come to know God’s love for them.

1. Paul reminds us that ultimately the light that we “shine before others” is not ours to claim – it comes from God, not from our own authority. Where can you give greater glory to God by your words and actions?

Celebrate the Vocation of Marriage

It is time to celebrate! National Marriage Week is February 7th through the 14th. It begins with National Marriage Day on February 8th. National Marriage Day began in the United States in 1983 and was popularized by the Catholic Church with the purpose of showing the world the beauty of marriage, through the faithfulness and sacrifice that husband-and-wife make while intertwined with Christ. It highlights how marriage and family are truly the very foundation of a successful society.

It doesn't take much to see that the institution of marriage is on the decline in the world. The world has impressed upon people that life is all about personal freedom and self-satisfaction. Weddings are seen as merely lavish events and that marriages may be made and broken to ensure personal pleasure. This goes completely against Church teaching.

We know marriage is a holy and sacred institution, because God gave us the first marriage. “God created man in His image, in the Divine image He created him. Male and female, He created them. God blessed them saying: Be fertile and multiply, fill the earth and subdue it.” Gen 1:27-28.

Jesus also sanctified marriage. “Have you not read that from the beginning the Creator made them male and female and said for this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife and the two shall become one flesh. So, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together no human being must separate.” Matt 19:4-6. This is the Church’s basis for sacramental, holy marriages, this is the Church’s basis for telling couples that marriage should be entered into freely and faithfully with the intent of being lifelong and fruitful. This is why marriage in the Church is compared to the self-sacrificing love of Christ. Marriage is a mirror of the love Christ has for His Church. In fact, each couple becomes a Domestic Church, a place where Jesus dwells.

We need to celebrate marriage. It's been proven, not just by the Church but by sociologists, psychologists, by other experts, that marriage affects children, family life, and society for the better. People no longer live for just themselves but put others' needs above their own. It is the duty of a husband and wife to work to get their spouse to heaven. This giving of self between a husband and a wife becomes a powerful witness to children and to society. So, let us celebrate the vocation of Marriage and thank God for it.

Did you know that St Joseph is the patron Saint of Marriage, Family, and Fathers? Never be afraid to ask for St Joseph's powerful intercession when it comes to your marriage and family.

St. Joseph will be the honored saint at the annual St. Valentine Party sponsored by Holy Trinity and St Gregory Parishes. This is a free event for all ages! Come for the camaraderie, food, and fun. 
Little Black Books

Evening Vespers

Holy Trinity invites you to experience and participate in Vespers during Lent. Vespers (also called Evening Prayer) is part of the Liturgy of the Hours. The prayer experience will be held *Thursday evenings at 5:30pm* (in place of the rosary) prior to the 6pm Mass.

In the Liturgy of the Hours, the Church fulfills Jesus' command to "pray always" (Luke 18:1; see also 1 Thessalonians 5:17). Through this prayer, the people of God sanctify the day by continual praise of God and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world.

Bishops, priests, deacons, and many men and women in consecrated life pray the Liturgy of the Hours each day. Their work is organized around this prayer, keeping God always at the center of their days. Lay people are encouraged to pray the Liturgy of the Hours as well.

Evening Prayer gives thanks for the day just past and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God (see Psalm 141:1).






