



Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: The magi in today's gospel do not speak very much, but they also do not need to – their actions speak loud enough. They recognize

the star in Bethlehem, and seeing it in the distance, they leave everything and follow it from miles away, trusting that something important would lie at the end of their journey. That action demonstrates faith belief in that which they have not seen. When they do speak, their words testify to their action and to God's: "We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." In their journey to Bethlehem, the magi demonstrate that they know who Jesus is and are willing to follow him.

To Experience: Sometimes, God appears to us in the grand and the brilliant, like the star of Bethlehem. At other times, God appears to us in the smallest of the small, like the newborn child found lying in a manger. God desires to make himself known to us, to reveal his infinite love – in the silence of prayer, in the embrace of a loved one, in the gift of himself in the Eucharist. Where is God trying to reveal himself to you today?

1. God was present to the magi by the star of Bethlehem but is present to each of us in different ways. Where do you see God most clearly? Where do you find it difficult to recognize God's presence?

Following the Star into a New Year

Dear Friends,

This Sunday, we celebrate the **Epiphany of the Lord**. It is also known as "the Christmas of the Gentiles." On this January 4, 2026, we watch as the Magi arrive at the stable, bringing the Christmas season to a majestic conclusion. Their journey reminds us that the light of Christ is not meant for a select few—it is a gift for every person, in every corner of the world.

The Courage to Seek

I have always been moved by the courage of the Wise Men. They left the comfort of their families, friends, belongings, and homes to follow a flickering light across a vast desert. They didn't have a google map or even a map; they only had a sign and a deep, restless desire to find the Truth.

In many ways, we are all "Magi." As we begin this new year, many of us are searching for meaning in life, for peace, or for a fresh start. The Epiphany reminds us that God is not hiding from us. He places "stars" in our lives—through the scriptures, the sacraments, and even through the kindness of strangers—to lead us to Him.

What Gifts Do We Bring?

The Magi offered gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But as we stand before the Lord today, we might wonder what we have to offer.

- **Gold:** We offer our daily work and our resources to help those in need.
- **Frankincense:** We offer our prayers, rising like incense, acknowledging God's presence in our lives.
- **Myrrh:** We offer our sorrows, our struggles, and our "broken" parts, knowing that Christ came to heal and accompany us in our humanity.

The "Epiphany" in Your Life

The word "Epiphany" means "manifestation" or "showing forth." My prayer for you in 2026 is that you experience a personal epiphany—a moment where you clearly see God's hand at work in your life. Don't be afraid to follow your "star," even if the path seems uncertain.

As the Magi "departed for their country by another way," we too are called to be changed by our encounter with Jesus. We cannot meet Him and remain the same. Let us walk into this new year with hearts set on fire, ready to share the Light of Christ with a world that so desperately needs it.

Thank you for being the "stars" that reflect God's light in our community! I am honored to serve you.

- St. Gregory follows Valders School District


NOTE: If districts are delayed, our schedule will NOT change.
