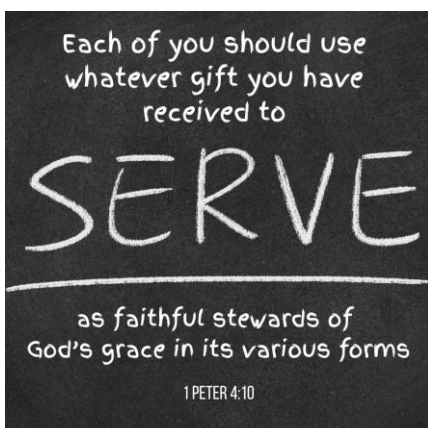

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Jesus gives the crowds three more parables this week: the parable of the weeds, the parable of the mustard seed, and the parable of the leaven. These parables all use imagery familiar to the crowds, each beginning to unravel the mystery of the kingdom of God. After Jesus gives his disciples an explanation of the first parable, he warns them using the same phrase we heard last week: "Whoever has ears ought to hear." As we see in the other two parables this Sunday, the kingdom of God is already present in initial form, growing to an incredible degree. However, that time of growth will come to an end. God and his angels will gather the righteous, that they might "shine like the sun" with God in heaven. The disciples of Jesus have a real choice to make: do they hear the word of God, or do they ignore it?

To Experience: God is a God of second chances. No matter what we've done or where we've been, God is waiting there for us to return to him. Sometimes it can be hard to get over the image (whether conscious or unconscious) of God as a demanding judge, holding us to account, especially when we hear parables like that in today's gospel. Rather than being a message of condemnation, it is a call to repentance and the embrace of God's forgiveness. We believe in a God who desires to have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

1. Where do you need to grow in patience this week?
2. How do you feel hearing the parable of the wheat and the weeds? Are you ready for the "harvest" at the end of time? What needs to be done in preparation?

The Mystery in the Everyday

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus speaks to us in a language we can all understand—the language of ordinary life. He uses three familiar images to unveil the deep mysteries of the Kingdom of God: the weeds growing among the wheat, the tiny mustard seed, and the yeast hidden in flour. By weaving these everyday examples into His teachings, Jesus shows us that the divine is constantly breaking into our ordinary routines.

These parables carry a double invitation for each of us: we must be both receptive and active in the Kingdom.

First, we are called to be receptive to how God works, which often requires great patience. When the disciples asked Jesus to explain the parable of the weeds and the wheat, He gently revealed that God allows both to grow together until the harvest.

Our hearts must be receptive to God's patient timeline, trusting that He is the master of the harvest who judges with clemency and leniency. We must actively guard against becoming discouraged by the presence of evil or "weeds" in the world and instead focus on nourishing our own roots in faith.

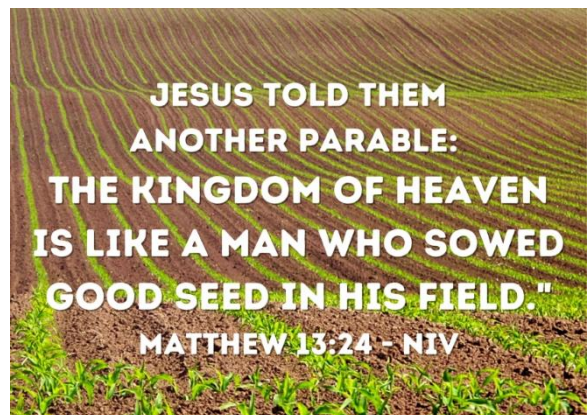
Second, the Kingdom requires our active participation. Like the small mustard seed that dynamically grows into a sheltering tree, or the pinch of yeast that actively transforms the entire batch of dough, our faith cannot remain stagnant. We are called to actively work, love, and serve, allowing God's grace to transform our families, our workplace, and our parish community from the inside out.

This week, let us look at our ordinary, daily lives through the lens of these parables. Where is God asking you to be more patient and receptive to His timing? How can you be more active in sharing His love with a world that is hungry for His truth?

Holy Trinity Parish Parking Lot Blacktop Project Question

Dear Parishioners ... We'd Appreciate Your Comments.

A significant portion of our parking lot was dug up from the new septic system project recently completed. Our existing parking lot is over 50 years old. It has numerous cracks from the sun and the cold and has heaved and sunken from winter's cold. It has become so uneven from patching over the years that it is difficult to properly remove snow and ice from winter storms, making walking through the parking lot hazardous at times.

Which leads us to why we are asking for your input. The dug-up portion of the parking lot will need to be patched before winter. We have estimates of about \$10,000 to properly prepare and patch the portion recently dug up from the rectory to the new septic system. This repair will prevent further damage to that area during the next winter and spring, but it will do nothing for the highest-used portion of the parking lot to the east of Church.

We also have estimates to replace the entire parking lot. A project that would cost less than \$150,000 and would eliminate all the existing damage that makes maintenance in winter difficult. It would give us a parking lot that would last for many years to come.

You have been very generous in recent years about capital improvements, which is why we are asking for your thoughts on this potentially large project. There is the possibility of donations to help offset the cost if this becomes a replacement project, but we still would like to hear from you.

On the weekend of July 25 & 26 at the 8am & 7pm Masses, we will be asking for your comments. If you are unable to share your comments at these Masses, please share your comments with the Parish Office before the end of July 2026.

Service Witness Talk

My name is Judy Jelinek and I've been a member of St Gregory Parish for over 40 years. I was recently asked by a member of the Stewardship Committee to speak about the SERVICE aspect of Stewardship, and what Service means to me.

Years ago, my aunt Marian Christel managed the St Nazianz Senior Center meals program. At that time, she was looking for a fill-in Meals-on-Wheels driver, so she asked if I could possibly help out. I reluctantly agreed. I was working full-time at the time and I knew that this would mean adding one more thing to my already busy life. Still, I wanted to help her out, so I said yes. As I began this new venture, I soon came to realize that for many of the people on my meals route, I was the only face they saw all day. The appreciation on their faces as I'd open the door to bring in their meal was priceless. I was reminded of the Psalm (105:4) which states: **Look to the Lord...SEEK HIS FACE ALWAYS.** Observing the faces of the people on my route, I began to recognize the face of Christ in each of them. There He was! Jesus told his disciples, "Whatever you do for the least of these, you do for ME." I was starting to understand what those words truly meant.

Today, years later, I'm still at it. Now, as I leave each home, I say a prayer that God bless each one of them, and I hope that they may have caught even the slightest glimpse of Jesus in me.

Since saying yes to my aunt's request years ago, a commitment to service has grown within me. Jesus said to "Love one another as I have loved you." Service **IS** Love. I invite you all to think about how you can serve in your parish or community. I know many of you already do so, but if not, don't be afraid to say YES, whether it be to volunteering in your parish by ushering, becoming a lector or joining a committee – or – by lending your hand to someone in need in the community.
