Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: Today's gospel rounds out the discourse in parables, and these last few are only for the disciples. Jesus gives the disciples three parables in a row, asks them, "Did you get all that?" and then gives them another one for good measure. The disciples might have understood these parables in a brief while, but for us today these images can be a source for countless hours of prayer, reflection, and integration into our lives. In both the parable of the pearl of great price and the parable of the buried treasure, a person comes across something of value and gives all that he has to chase after it. The focus of both parables is on the individual's response to the discovery of the kingdom, whether looking for it or not. Each is overjoyed by the discovery, but neither is satisfied with that; both sell everything in search of the kingdom.

To Experience: The life of faith is long and tiresome. It's hard to hold onto hope. It's hard to love our neighbors. It's hard to keep showing up again and again. The parables of the buried treasure and pearl of great price remind us to hold on to the experiences that sustain us – the moments of joy and mercy and healing that God has given us that first allowed us to fall in love with the God who loves us infinitely.

1. What are the things that you value most? What do you need to give up in order to search after the kingdom?
2. Where are you able to find joy in following God's law? Where does it feel more like an obligation or a tiresome burden?

Jesus' Focus is Different

In the Gospel account, crowds and religious leaders frequently demand a miraculous sign from Jesus to prove His divine authority. They look for extraordinary, spectacular displays in the sky or immediate political liberation to validate His words.

Jesus consistently refuses to perform miracles as mere spectacles or tests. He rebukes the desire for sensational proof, famously stating that no sign will be given to a skeptical generation except the "sign of Jonah"—a prophetic pointer to His own death and resurrection after three days.

Instead of outward spectacles, Jesus shifts the focus entirely to the internal reality of the Kingdom of God. Through the parables, He emphasizes that the Kingdom operates quietly and requires deep spiritual discernment:

Internal Transformation: The Kingdom grows silently from within, like a mustard seed or leaven, rather than through sudden, dramatic displays.

Ultimate Value: Jesus highlights the Kingdom as a hidden treasure or a pearl of great price, urging people to invest their whole hearts into discovering it.

Active Discernment: He focuses on the need for wisdom to recognize God's presence in the ordinary moments of daily life rather than waiting for extraordinary signs.

Holy Trinity Parish Parking Lot Blacktop Project Question

Dear Parishioners ... We'd Appreciate Your Comments.

A significant portion of our parking lot was dug up from the new septic system project recently completed. Our existing parking lot is over 50 years old. It has numerous cracks from the sun and the cold and has heaved and sunken from winter's cold. It has become so uneven from patching over the years that it is difficult to properly remove snow and ice from winter storms, making walking through the parking lot hazardous at times.

Which leads us to why we are asking for your input. The dug-up portion of the parking lot will need to be patched before winter. We have estimates of about \$10,000 to properly prepare and patch the portion recently dug up from the rectory to the new septic system. This repair will prevent further damage to that area during the next winter and spring, but it will do nothing for the highest-used portion of the parking lot to the east of Church.

We also have estimates to replace the entire parking lot. A project that would cost less than \$150,000 and would eliminate all the existing damage that makes maintenance in winter difficult. It would give us a parking lot that would last for many years to come.

You have been very generous in recent years about capital improvements, which is why we are asking for your thoughts on this potentially large project. There is the possibility of donations to help offset the cost if this becomes a replacement project, but we still would like to hear from you.

On the weekend of July 25 & 26 at the 8am & 7pm Masses, we will be asking for your comments. If you are unable to share your comments at these Masses, please share your comments with the Parish Office before the end of July 2026.

St. Ignatius of Loyola: Feast Day July 31

- A remarkable Spanish priest and theologian.
- Founded the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits.
- His dedication to God and humanity makes him an enduring inspiration for all generations.

Things to know and share about the life and legacy of St. Ignatius of Loyola:

1. Inigo de Loyola was born into a noble family in Spain in 1491. He was the youngest of 13 children.
2. He became an officer in the Spanish army. In 1521, a cannonball wound he received in battle left him bedridden. This hardship eventually led to his conversion.
3. One year later, he gave up his life and riches as a soldier and left home with a zeal for God.
4. He wrote "The Spiritual Exercises," a series of compilations on meditations, prayers, and other practices.
5. Saints Francis Xavier and Peter Faber were his roommates at the University of Paris.
6. He was a founder of the Society of Jesus. Pope Paul III recognized the Jesuits as an official religious order in 1540.
7. He celebrated his first Mass as a priest on Christmas morning.
8. He penned over 6,800 letters in his lifetime
9. Saint Ignatius of Loyola is the patron saint of education, retreats, soldiers, and The Society of Jesus.

A prayer for generosity written by this powerhouse saint:

*"Teach us, good Lord,
to serve you as you deserve;
to give, and not to count the cost,
to fight, and not to heed the wounds,
to toil, and not to seek for rest,
to labor, and not to ask for reward,
except that of knowing that we are doing your will."*
