Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: For the past several Sundays in the lectionary, Jesus has told the apostles that their journey will be difficult and require much of them. This Sunday's reading takes a decidedly different tone. Jesus' attention turns away from the Twelve and toward his Father in heaven and those who have yet to believe in him. Those who are childlike have been able to recognize Christ, while those who are learned and rely on their own understanding have not believed. Jesus identifies himself here as the locus of revelation. He has received everything from the Father, and he himself is the only way to come to know the Father. In this, Jesus promises rest for all those who come to him and take on the yoke of discipleship, instead of the burdensome yoke of the pharisaic interpretation of the Law. Jesus is into advising primarily a "spirit-of-the-law" approach in opposition to legalism, but has come to bring the Mosaic Law to its fulfillment in himself. Even as following Jesus is to be difficult, there will be a joy in this new relationship with God through Jesus.

To Experience: Jesus' claim that his "yoke is easy" can land differently. At some times, it can feel like being a Christian is just one rule after another. At others, being a Christian can be great in theory but just a label in practice, Jesus' yoke left untouched. In any case, Jesus invites us to come to him as we are and offers us his infinite love, no conditions attached.

The Wisdom of the Little Ones

"I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to the little ones."

This teaching flips the standards of our world completely upside down. Society tells us that power, intellectual pride, self-reliance, and advanced credentials are the keys to unlocking life's mysteries. Yet, Jesus reveals that the deep, life-changing truths of God's Kingdom cannot be bought, earned, or figured out by human cleverness alone. They are gifts reserved for the humble.

Who Are the "Wise and Learned"?

In this passage, Jesus is not condemning education or intelligence. Rather, He is warning against intellectual pride.

- **The Barrier of Self-Sufficiency:** The "wise and learned" represent the scribes and Pharisees of His day. They were so blinded by their own religious expertise, legalism, and social status that they could not see the Messiah standing right in front of them.
- **The Danger of Pride:** When we rely entirely on our own strength, control, and understanding, we close our hearts to grace. We become unteachable, leaving no room for God to work.

The Power of Spiritual Childhood

The "little ones"—the *neptoi* in the original Greek text—literally means infants or untutored babes. Jesus uses this image to describe the prerequisite for receiving Divine wisdom:

- **Total Dependence:** An infant does not worry about providing for tomorrow; a baby simply trusts completely in the care of the parent. Spiritual childhood means acknowledging that we are completely dependent on God for everything.
- **Uncluttered Hearts:** Children possess a natural capacity for wonder, simplicity, and immediate trust. They do not approach relationships with hidden agendas or cynical skepticism.
- **Real Wisdom:** True wisdom is not about knowing everything. It is about knowing Whose we are. The little ones possess the ultimate wisdom: they know they are profoundly loved by the Father, and they trust Him implicitly.

This week, let us pray for the grace of a small heart. Let us drop our defenses, surrender our need for control, and approach our Lord with the simple, joyful trust of His little ones.

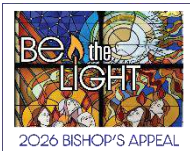
