To Die For

This week, St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Romans, "Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly." St. Paul goes on to say that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. What is St. Paul telling us? Well, I think most of us know by now that Christ came to die for us, to make atonement for our sins, so we could have the opportunity to live forever with Him and the Father in Heaven.

Can you imagine having this kind of love that allows you to die for strangers, for people who haven't even been born yet? Can you imagine having the love needed to forgive people that have hurt you and then making the reparation for their wrongs by giving up your life?

That is the question that remains for us. Who are we willing to sacrifice ourselves for? Could we follow Christ's example and actually physically die for someone that we don't even know? By our Baptism, we are called to die with Christ so we can rise with Him. We are called to sacrifice.

Most of us will not be called to a sacrifice as dramatic as actually dying for someone. We are, however, often called to die metaphorically for others. We may find it easy to sacrifice for the people we love. Isn't this what we do in the Sacrament of Marriage? We die to our old life by putting our spouse before ourselves. We make sacrifices all the time for each other in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health. If we have children, we die to self, making sure they are cared for. Elderly parents require us to sacrifice time and resources. We can understand this kind of sacrifice. We love and are loved in return. There is a give and take to these sacrifices, and most of the time, we have the love and the strength to make them.

However, the real test comes for us when we deal with people we hardly know, or people that we do not really like, or people who have deeply hurt or betrayed us. How do we follow Christ's example? How can we sacrifice and die for them? It takes real effort to forgive and serve those who might not appreciate it.

To truly follow Christ's example, we need a strong relationship with Him through prayer. This spiritual connection helps us become who Christ wants us to be. We can pray to be more open, less rigid, and wiser in our interactions. We can, of course, pray that others see the light and change their ways. However, we may do better to pray for wisdom to know when we should speak and when we should be quiet. We pray that Jesus is there in every situation to guide us and that He helps us see others as He does so that we can will the good of the other first.

St. Paul's message in Romans encourages us to think about how deep our love is and how willing we are to sacrifice. The answer is not in our human worthiness but in divine grace because Christ's choice to die for us, sinners, is a love like no other. Let's pray that we have the strength to love in His image and that we can make the sacrifices we will be called to make.

Thoughts for Today's Readings



To the Point: Having compassion for the crowds, Jesus responds to their need by sending his apostles. They came from a variety of professions, ideologies, and life experiences, but they were all chosen to follow Jesus – a calling that sent them throughout Israel, at least during the lifetime of Jesus. This initial instruction from Jesus in today's gospel is because of the special relationship of God to his chosen people: "You will be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation" (Exod 19:6). As a kingdom of priests, Israel is tasked with consecrating the whole world for God, and that will ultimately take place through Jesus, his apostles, and his church. In this privileged position, the "lost sheep of the house of Israel" are the first to receive the proclamation of the kingdom of God. The mission to proclaim the gospel to all nations begins only after the death and resurrection of Jesus, which we heard about from the end of Matthew's Gospel on the Solemnity of the Ascension.

To Experience: Many times, the best way we can recognize God's deep love for us is through the people that God puts into our lives – our friends, family, significant others, and all those people that help us to feel loved. Though God shares this truth throughout the Old Testament, the incarnation and ministry of Jesus is perhaps the greatest testament to this truth – in this, God desires to love us as human. If the people we share life with, imperfect as they are, can love us to the extent that they do, how much more does our heavenly Father care for each of us?

1. In what ways does God make God's love known to you? Through the sacraments? Through other people? Through creation?

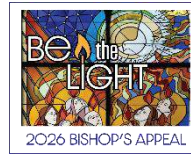

Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 12

What is the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus?

The Heart is the symbol of human love. This Catholic devotion honors the Sacred Heart of Our Lord, through which was manifested to us God's eternal love for everyone. "God is Love" (1 John 4:8), and so in honoring the human expression of that Love, especially on the Cross, we honor Its Divine Source.

Why is the Sacred Heart important?

St. John Paul II said, "*The Sacred Heart has given us everything — redemption, salvation, sanctification.*"

The Sacred Heart is the actual heart of Christ and also indicates His love for humanity. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "The prayer of the Church venerates and honors the Heart of Jesus just as it invokes his most holy name. It adores the incarnate Word and his Heart which, out of love for men, he allowed to be pierced by our sins." (CCC 2669)

"If I cannot see the brilliance of your Face or hear your sweet voice, O my God, I can live by your grace, I can rest on your Sacred Heart!" – St. Thérèse of Lisieux

Why is Jesus' Heart on fire?

Jesus told St. Margaret Mary, "My Sacred Heart is so intense in its love for men, and for you in particular, that not being able to contain within it the flames of its ardent charity, they must be transmitted through all means."

St. Gertrude the Great said, "O Sacred Heart of Jesus, fountain of eternal life, Your Heart is a glowing furnace of Love. You are my refuge and my sanctuary. O my adorable and loving Savior, consume my heart with the burning fire with which Yours is aflame. Pour down on my soul those graces which flow from Your love. Let my heart be united with Yours. Let my will be conformed to Yours in all things. May Your Will be the rule of all my desires and actions. Amen."

Why does Jesus point to His Heart?

In Sacred Heart imagery, Jesus usually points to His Heart. This is to indicate His eternal love for each one of us.

What is the First Friday devotion?

Jesus Himself started the First Friday devotion. The last of twelve Sacred Heart Promises, He said, "I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

Immaculate Heart of Mary Saturday, June 13

What does the Immaculate Heart of Mary mean?

The Immaculate Heart of Mary signifies, first of all, the great purity and love of the heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary for God. This purity is manifested in her "Yes" to the Father at the Incarnation, Her love for, and cooperation with, the Incarnate Son in His redemptive mission, and her docility to the Holy Spirit, enabling her to remain free of the stain of personal sin throughout her life. Mary's Immaculate

Heart, therefore, points us to her profound interior life, where she experienced both joys and sorrows, yet remained faithful, as we, too, are called to do.

Why do we honor Mary's Immaculate Heart?

St. John Paul II said, "From Mary we learn to love Christ, her Son and the Son of God.... Learn from her to be always faithful, to trust that God's Word to you will be fulfilled, and that nothing is impossible with God."

When we honor the Immaculate Heart, we give ultimate honor to Jesus. As we honor the Mother, we honor the Son. In addition, the Blessed Virgin is our mother as well (see Revelation 12:17), and her mother's heart is incomparable. St. Louis de Montfort said, "If you put all the love of all the mothers into one heart, it still would not equal the love of the heart of Mary for her children."

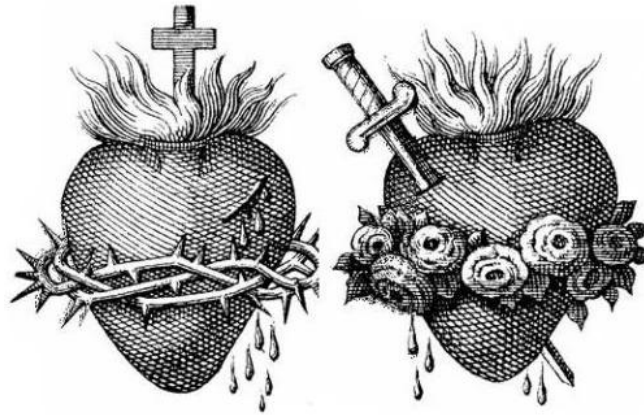
How do the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary relate to each other?

The Servant of God Lúcia de Jesus Rosa dos Santos, one of the Fátima visionaries, said, "The work of our redemption began at the moment when the Word descended from Heaven in order to assume a human body in the womb of Mary. From that moment, and for the next nine months, the Blood of Christ was the Blood of Mary, taken from Her Immaculate Heart; the Heart of Christ was beating in unison with the Heart of Mary."

Also, Jesus Himself appeared to Sr. Lucia, saying, "I want My Church to . . . put the devotion to this Immaculate Heart beside the devotion to My Sacred Heart."

"Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did." – St. Maximilian Kolbe

"You must never separate what God has so perfectly united. So closely are Jesus and Mary bound up with each other that whoever beholds Jesus sees Mary; whoever loves Jesus, loves Mary; whoever has devotion to Jesus, has devotion to Mary." – St. John Eudes
