Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: On the last Sunday before Holy Week, we reach the zenith of Jesus' ministry and his greatest miracle. For the second week in a row, the gospel reading from John shows Jesus asking an incredibly direct question. Again, the actions of Jesus prompt a decision. Jesus returns to Bethany upon hearing that Lazarus has died, meeting the grieving Martha and Mary. At first, with a mixture of sadness, hope, and maybe a pinch of accusation, they each say in turn, "Lord, if you had been here, by brother would not have died." Martha in particular seems to hold onto both faith and doubt, as she again questions Jesus as they approach the tomb. Jesus' response is on the one hand consolatory but on the other is quite pointed. Jesus both questions Martha's faith and invites her deeper into it. The Scriptures do the same to us as we approach the liturgical commemoration of Jesus' passion and death. As the letter to the Hebrews warns, "the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword". Do *you* believe that you will see the glory of God?

To Experience: We might find ourselves sharing the same sentiment as Martha and Mary, wondering why those we care about have been allowed to suffer and experience death when Jesus promises life. That's a question for which no apologetics can provide a satisfactory answer. Rebuking the despair of death, the resurrection of Jesus offers us hope in a life where pain and suffering shall cease. The raising of Lazarus is a sign of greater future that awaits us all, if we but have faith.

1. Where has God delivered you from "death" into new life? What was your response?
2. In what ways has Jesus invited you to trust in him more this Lent?

The Powerful Sixth Sign in John's Gospel

In today's Gospel, we witness the **raising of Lazarus**, the powerful "sixth sign" in John's narrative. This miracle serves as a profound symbolic precursor to Jesus' own **Final Victory** over death. By calling his friend from the tomb, Jesus demonstrates that he is the promised **Messianic Deliverer**, offering us a tangible sign anticipating the glory of his own Resurrection.

A striking thread of divine purpose connects this week to the last. Last Sunday, we heard that the man was born blind so that the "**works of God might be made visible.**" Today, Jesus echoes this, declaring that Lazarus' illness is not to end in death, but is for the **glory of God**. In both instances, human suffering and mortality are transformed into the stage for God's miraculous power.

As we approach the end of our Lenten journey, the Church assures us that we, too, will be raised. **Resurrection Hope** is our central theme; it reminds us that our battle with sin and death is not in vain. Our faith in Jesus—who is "**the Resurrection and the Life**"—is a promise of our own participation in his eternal new life.

12 Ways to Make Holy Week More Meaningful

1. **THINK PRAYER.** If you have to work or go to school during Holy Week, think about how you can incorporate prayer breaks into each day.
2. **MAKE AN ADDITIONAL SACRIFICE** by fasting and abstaining from meat on Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday in addition to Good Friday.
3. **DON'T WATCH TELEVISION** from sundown on Holy Thursday until Easter morning.
4. **GO** to confession.
5. **SET ASIDE** 10 minutes every day to read Passion accounts in the Gospels.
6. Make it a point to **FORGIVE** someone on Good Friday.
7. **PRAY** the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary.
8. **OFFER UP** any pain or difficulties you experience during Holy Week and unite your sufferings with the pain of Christ.
9. **PRAY** the Stations of the Cross.
10. **ATTEND** all of the Triduum liturgies.
11. **INVITE** family members, friends and neighbors — especially people who have strayed from the church — to come to church with you.
12. **VOLUNTEER** to help decorate your parish for Easter.




