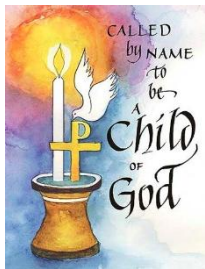

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Following Jesus' instruction about dispute in community, Peter approaches Jesus with a question about forgiveness. Peter

suggests one could forgive up to seven times – seven considered a perfect number, in reference to the completion of creation in rest on the seventh day. One might infer that Peter thought seven was a high number. Last week's example of conflict resolution gave just three strikes before one was declared out of community. However, Jesus mandates forgiveness for not just seven but seventy-seven times – essentially, as many as needed. Jesus illustrates this point with the parable of the unforgiving servant. The servant's debt is an incredibly large amount, one that he could never hope to repay, but yet the king makes the impossibly generous decision to wipe it away. God is incredibly generous with each of us showing us endless mercy despite our many faults and failings. If we like the servant turn around and deny forgiveness to others, we create an obstacle to receiving God's mercy ourselves.

To Experience: Forgiveness is one of the most difficult parts of being a Christian, but it is also one of the most important. In a society grappling with "cancel culture" and the question of how long to hold someone's actions against them, the example of Jesus' unconditional forgiveness can be an ideal to aspire to, even if it's difficult to live out. How can we expect God to "forgive us our trespasses" if we do not "forgive those who trespass against us?"

1. Can you recognize the parable's images of forgiveness and unforgiveness in your life right now? Which relationships are still in need of healing?

Heartfelt Forgiveness

Jesus challenges us with a powerful teaching on the absolute necessity of mercy. After sharing the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant, He concludes with a sobering warning: we must forgive our brothers and sisters from our heart.

It is easy to request God's infinite mercy for ourselves, yet we often hold onto grudges against those who hurt us.

True Christian forgiveness is not a superficial gesture or a mere social politeness. Instead, it requires a profound transformation that clears away bitterness and releases the offender from their debt.

When we refuse to forgive, we trap ourselves in a prison of resentment and block the flow of God's grace in our lives. Christ reminds us that because we have been freely forgiven an unpayable debt of sin, we must extend that same radical mercy to others.

This kind of deep, heartfelt forgiveness can feel humanly impossible when the wounds are deep. However, the Holy Spirit provides the supernatural grace we need to let go of anger and choose love. This week, let us pray for the courage to open our hearts and truly forgive anyone who has wronged us.
