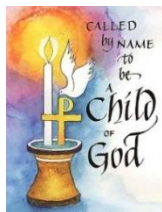

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Jesus' parable this Sunday can irritate us. We might find ourselves sympathetic with the early-morning workers, out in the sun all day only to receive the same pay as those who had just arrived. "Equal pay for equal work," seems right by our standard of justice and for good reason.



In contrast, the parable defies human logic. The landowner pays the usual daily wage to all workers – not denying anyone their agreed upon daily wage, but choosing to be generous to his latest hires, knowing that they too need to be able to eat what they need for the day. From another angle, this parable shows that God cannot divide himself and give someone "half" of heaven. If heaven is the gift of God's self, God does not hold back that gift, instead giving himself totally. The question then is not of God's generosity, but our own ability to receive God's gift. Thus, "the last will be first and the first will be last."

To Experience: Eternal life with God is not something we can earn, no matter how good we are or how much good we do. It is always a free, unmerited gift from a God who loves us infinitely. Despite that, we worry about being "better Christians" than other people, consciously or unconsciously striving to make God love us more. At other times, we wish we could have just become Christians on our deathbeds, doing whatever we want in the meantime. Both mindsets get in the way of everything God desires for us in this life and eternity: to transform us by his grace and fill our hearts with his love.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers. Instead of waiting for workers to come to him, the master actively goes out into the marketplace.

He returns repeatedly—at noon, at three o'clock, and even at the very last hour of the day. This constant going out reveals the true heart of our heavenly Father, who never ceases to seek us.

God does not sit back and wait for us to find him; he pursues us tirelessly in our daily lives. His invitations are not based on our human schedules or what we think we deserve. He meets us exactly where we are, whether we have served him for a lifetime or just a moment.

When the workday ends, the master surprises everyone by paying the latecomers the exact same full wage. This radical act shows that God's grace is not a business contract based on merit or hours logged.

His mercy is a free and limitless gift, flowing from a generous heart that wants everyone to receive his best.

Witness Story: Service **Steve Noworatzky**

I've been part of this parish, off and on, since my early childhood. I made my First Communion here when there was a railing. All my schooling was done here at the grade school and St. Gregory High School back in the 60's. But then, it was time for me to spread my wings and leave this town not knowing that I would eventually come back.

As I was reflecting on what I was going to share with you today, I found myself thinking of my experiences with serving for God's sake. He gave me the capacity and willingness to be a steward of my talents. Just like all of you who have certain God-given talents. One of those gifts we share is a "need to give". I believe God had a plan for me. Of course, there are different ways of giving. I want to speak about giving of my time.

As I mentioned earlier, I grew up here. So, one of my first recollections of service to God was serving Mass as an altar boy. It took me awhile to learn the Latin prayer responses at that time. It was a special feeling up there at the altar because the sanctuary is a holy place that few people can experience. I served all through high school.

I continued schooling in Milwaukee, moved to Illinois, served my country overseas, got married in Pennsylvania, and eventually moved back here with a family. My wife and I raised four kids and they all graduated from St. Gregory Grade School. We felt that getting a good Catholic education was important. During that time, I was involved with coaching basketball and baseball in the summer. My wife and I also shared serving as Eucharistic Ministers at the time. When my sons were old enough, I served with them as altar boys.

As a parishioner, I served on many committees and currently as Secretary Trustee. My service of stewardship for this parish has given me great satisfaction. Even though the scheduling can and does get challenging sometimes. There have been times when I couldn't meet a commitment, so I usually traded with someone who could do the same.

My service of being a reader has been the most profound experience. God has blessed me with a voice to proclaim His Word at Mass. On occasion, I will choose to remain at the altar after the readings. Those are the times when I feel completely in awe during the Consecration. Truly, feeling the presence of our Lord Jesus. This is what serving our Lord is all about. And I thank God for that experience.

I invite you to think about how you can serve. We are in need of Mass servers, Eucharistic Ministers, Readers, Greeters, and other committee positions. One ministry especially dear to my heart is being a second-grade catechist. I started teaching shortly after becoming a member, over 40 years ago. It has helped me grow in my own faith journey. My students have taught me so much!

We encourage families to make it grow. We all need to be role models for our youth. Many volunteers have seen previous relatives active in their parish and community. God is good.

A priest who gave a parish mission years ago had a saying I never forgot and practice daily, "no Bible, no breakfast, no Bible, no bed." It's a great way to start and end the day – if only a few minutes. Try it – you'll be amazed, how life has more meaning. God is good.

I have enjoyed volunteering in various areas. Volunteers are very dear to my heart – they are generous, helpful, and kind. We are truly blessed to have so many. They are wonderful stewards of their time. Service is an extension of Sunday worship into everyday life. We truly are God's hand and feet. God can do great things through you. God is good.

Jesus was the perfect model of what a life of service looks like. He healed. He cooked, and he even washed feet! The more we give of ourselves, the more Christ-like we become. Every day we need to ask, "How can I serve you today?" or "Who can I bless today?"

Good stewards witness in both word and action. Stewardship means caring and sharing God's gifts. We need to care for our families, our homes, our community, our environment, and even our own health. May each of us find ways to be a parish and community that reflects the love of Christ.
