Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: This parable affirms God's special care for those who are poor and speaks a word of warning to those who are too comfortable in this life. We might see, though, that the comforts the rich man experienced are not his real issue. It is his refusal to see Lazarus as a fellow human being. He ignores his suffering even when it is right outside his door. He is not much better in death; when he sees Lazarus in comfort, his immediate thought is how he can be used to alleviate his own suffering. He still sees Lazarus as disposable – surely Abraham can send this nothing of a man to serve his needs or to warn his brothers of what is to come. His hardness of heart, the real cause of his suffering, is on full display.

To Experience: In today's world, many of us live rather comfortable lives. We often confuse luxuries with necessities. Clever corporate marketing has us thinking that indulgences are "self-care" that we would be remiss to do without. (Self-care is important, but it has to do more with the regular disciplines of nutrition, rest, and movement than with Instagram-worthy latte art.) These readings remind us that we need to take a good, hard look at what our needs really are and how we might share our surplus with those still in need.

1. Who is Lazarus in your life? What needs in others might you be overlooking as you go about your day-to-day busyness?
2. What luxuries do you find yourself indulging in regularly? Could you find a way to cut back on something to make more room for sharing your resources with others?
3. How do you guard against complacency? What sorts of disciplines help you find room for growth?

Hear to Serve... A CALL TO WAR AND PEACE

In our second reading this week from St. Paul's Letter to Timothy, St. Paul begins with a contradiction. St Paul tells Timothy to be gentle in spirit and to be righteous, have devotion, faith, love patience and gentleness. Then in the same sentence St. Paul tells Timothy to "compete well for the Faith, to lay hold of eternal life." St. Paul wants Timothy to have a fighting spirit, and never give up the fight, so that he can gain eternal life.

Sounds like St. Paul is telling Timothy to seek both War and Peace. How can that happen? We have to realize St. Paul isn't offering us war and peace of this earth, St Paul is talking about the war and peace that Christ offers us. St. Paul is talking about a peace that we need to have with God, our neighbor and ourselves. The war he talks about is the battle we must have with our sins and sins of the world. How does this all happen, where does this all start?

It all starts on the day of our Baptism as our parents make those Baptismal promises for us. Our parents are asked if they want Baptism in Christ's Church. Then they mark us to become a child of God by tracing the sign of the cross on our foreheads. Then they make the Baptismal promises for us. Do you reject Satan, and all his evil works? Our parents have made a decree as to which team we are going to be on. Our parents are asked several times if they are going to fight for us to keep the faith in Jesus the Christ alive in us.

There comes the day when you must pick up the fight for yourselves, and that is the day of your Confirmation. Last week we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with 49 young adults in the area, three from St Gregory Parish.

They were asked to renew those Baptismal promises and to declare which team they want to fight on. They were asked, "Do you reject Satan? And all his works? Do you renounce sin?" As they made these promises, they were preparing to receive great weapons to help them in their fight. As Bishop Ricken anointed each young adult he said, "Be sealed with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit."

These gifts are Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Council, Fortitude, Piety, and Fear of the Lord. These are the great weapons that allow us to wage spiritual war against Satan, our sins, and the sins of the world. (The Seven Deadly Sins)

You see, so many people want to think that Confirmation Day is a day of graduation, a day when we don't have to learn anything more about the faith, a day when we don't have to battle anymore. If this is what we think, then we have just surrendered the battle. The Sacrament of Confirmation is really an encounter with the Holy Spirit that strengthens us, prepares us to pick up our sword and shield from our parents, and to join them and the entire Church in the battle.

I pray that all of us who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation will use the powerful gifts of the Holy Spirit to continue the fight. I hope that we never give up so that one day we will find true peace with God, neighbor and ourselves. If you have not received this amazing sacrament, it is not too late to receive the powerful Gifts of the Holy Spirit and to join in the victory of Jesus Christ over sin and death. Peace be with you.

SG one by One Campaign Funds Recommendation

SG Finance Council has made a recommendation to redirect the balance of funds from the one by One Campaign (after the cost of the narthex) toward building and maintenance needs of the parish.
