Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Jesus does not see his followers as living isolated lives, each following him on their own, but sharing that pursuit together in community. In fact, this community is itself a vessel for God's grace: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I." However, Jesus also recognizes the challenges of community life, giving the Twelve criteria by which to handle disputes among believers. Even in the case of conflict, relationship is not to be ignored – initially, conflicts should be worked out between conflicting parties directly, without drawing others into gossip. Conflict that persists damages the entire community, however, not just those involved, and at that point it must be mediated in the context of the local community, still with the intent of restoring right relationship. However, sometimes drawing a boundary is necessary for the sake of all, with that hope that dissent is worked out in distance. Decision-making on behalf of the community is here extended to all of the Twelve. It is an authority that is rooted in Peter's leadership, but is exercised together as apostles in common.

To Experience: Earlier in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus asks us to "love our enemies," but this Sunday's gospel reading helps us to understand that love can take different forms, especially in the case of loving someone who has hurt us deeply. Sometimes, setting boundaries using Jesus' framework can create a space where healing is possible, with the hope of future reconciliation in whatever capacity grace allows.

Embracing the "Outcast"

Jesus gives us a clear framework for dealing with conflict and sin within our community. He instructs us to speak privately with someone who hurts us, then with witnesses, and finally to bring the matter to the Church. But it is His final instruction that truly challenges us: if the person still refuses to listen, we must *"treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector."*

At first glance, this sounds like an order to reject, banish, or excommunicate the wrongdoer. But we must ask ourselves: How did Jesus treat Gentiles and tax collectors?

He did not cast them out. He sat at their tables. He ate with them. He called Matthew, a tax collector, to be an Apostle. He praised the faith of the Roman Centurion and healed the daughter of the Canaanite woman.

To treat someone like a Gentile or a tax collector does not mean cutting them off from our love. It means recognizing that they are hurting, disconnected, and in need of the Gospel all over again. It means our approach must shift from correction to evangelization, from argument to radical hospitality.

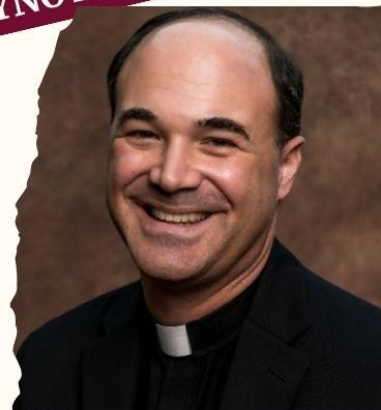
